

Tuesday Aug 10. Throughout
these 24 hours light and from
N. to N. W. varied several times and
and at 6 A.M. commenced, H.B.
X struck got him alongside at 5
and commenced cutting, got all
through at 6 A.M. At 11 P.M. H.B.
landed and H.B. struck him at 11 P.M.

Wednesday Aug 11. These 24 hours
moderate winds from N. to N. W. employed
in chasing whales all day.

Thursday Aug 12. All of these
24 hours winds from S. W. to N. W.
landed and Labrador boat struck
by H.B. got him alongside. There being
a bad sea the boat got capsized and
lost the line, and let go anchor
and started the work. At 7 A.M.
moderate and commenced cutting
by H.B. all through.

Friday Aug 13. Comes with moderate breeze from S. W.
X a laying at anchor, employed in boiling
and stowing down. Middle and latter
part winds from S. W. to N. W. H.B.
landed and H.B. struck him at
4 P.M. got him alongside.

Saturday Aug 14. All through
these 24 hours moderate breeze from S. W.
S. by E. a laying at anchor employed
in boiling and stowing down.

Sunday Aug 15. Comes with light
breeze from S. by East at anchor
employed in cutting. Spike ship
Harron of Adams Hole four whales
this season. She came to anchor
close by us toward and struck.

Monday Aug 16. These 24 hours
light winds from S. by E. with
foggy weather employed in stowing
down in the fore hatch and a laying
Ship Harron insight a cutting.

Tuesday Aug 17. Fast and
middle parts of these 24 hours strong
winds from N. to N. W. by N. employed
in boiling and stowing down a laying
at anchor.

Wednesday Aug 18. Comes with strong gale from N. N. W.
employed in boiling. Finished stowing
down the last fore gal on starboard side
of the fore hatch at 5.13 P.M.
