

Friday Aug 20.

Throughout these 24 hours strong gales from N.W. to a lay in at anchor. At 7 A.M. fire shot and at 10 past 9 had anchor on the line and ship made double reefed topsails. Lat by Obs 65.50 N. Long. " Chron. 169.41 W.

Saturday Aug 21.

Came with light breeze from S.E. heading N. Hemmed with ship Hercules, Bark Baltic and Edworas. Lat by Obs 65.03 N. Long. " Chron. 169.25 W.

Sunday Aug 22.

Came with light winds and pleasant weather heading North by N. At 3 A.M. passed East Cape of Asia with several sails in sight all from Northward. Lat by Obs 66.33 N. Long. Chron. 170.34 W.

Monday Aug 23.

All through the 24 hours winds from S.E. to East. Frost and moderate parts heading N.W. Latter part heading from S.W. to S.E. Spoke ship India of St. Vincent, American whaler, and Nimra of N. B. Lat by Obs 66.35 N. Long. Chron. 172.23 W.

Tuesday Aug 24.

Moderate winds from S.E. to E.

Wednesday Aug 25.

All of these 24 hours winds from S.E. to East a backing to and fro. Twenty to thirty sails in sight and no whales. Spoke ship Cornelius Hardland a whaler. Latitude by Obs 66.33 N.

Thursday Aug 26.

All of these 24 hours light Easterly wind a backing to and fro. At 7 A.M. lowered for whales and the B.D. Minck. Spoke had him alongside by 4 P.M. all through cutting. Lat by Obs 66.33 N. Long. " Chron. 172.12 W.

Friday August 27.

Fresh breeze all through these 24 hours from N. Ship made double reefed main, mizzen and foresail tacking to and fro employed in tacking.

Saturday Aug 28.

Winds from N. with more or less fog, tacking to and fro employed in tacking and standing down in Harbor side of the fish hole. Finished tacking. Lat by Obs 66.30 N. Long. " Chron. 172.13 W.

Sunday Aug 29.

Light wind from N. with more or less fog. Spoke ships Splendid and Venice and Hamble and the Brighton. " " 4.
