Monday Oct 11. 1852.

Thus 24 hours
first part light air and calm
from E.E. to South W. and a latter
part from E.N.E. to N.E. heading S.E. by E
employed in washing ship outside.

Tuesday Oct 12

All of these 24 hours
fine breeze from N.E. to N.E. by East
steering S.E. by E. employed in
ordinary work about deck. Sat by obs 2.42.

Wednesday Oct 13

Throughout these
24 hours fresh winds from N.E. heading
S.E. by E. employed in painting.

Sat by obs 24.58.0.

Thursday Oct 14

All of these 24
hours fresh breeze from N.E. with
fair weather steering S.E. by E. latter
part steering S. by E. Sat by obs 22.15.0.

Long. Chron 154.08.0.

Friday Oct 15

All of these 24 hours
fresh breeze from N.E. to N. S.W. and
middle part heading S. by E. from 5 PM
until 7 A.M. steering S. At 10 P.M. at 4
PM took a hulk and at 5 came to anchor
in 42 fathoms of water. 1 whaling ship
and a merchant's bark taking up from ship Antonio
of Sag Harbor 16 him and this season. Latter part rain.

on her passage to the Samanick Isles

Saturday Oct 16

All hands employed in
beating out line and mending an old
boat on shore for shore use. More or less
rain all through the day.

Sunday Oct 17

This day nothing of any consequence
going on. One watch on liberty. More or less
rain all day.

Monday Oct 18

All hands employed in getting oil
from shore that we left here last spring.
Three ships arrived here today. Throughout
the day more or less rain.

Tuesday Oct 19

All hands employed in storing down
oil and boating off provision from shore.
In coming off with a raft of Beef is
capsized.

Wednesday Oct 20

All hands employed in painting
ships. Getting off a raft of water and pipes
of bread from shore and trying to find
the beef we lost overboard. We could not
find it. Three sails arrived here today.

Thursday Oct 21

All hands employed in cleaning
out between decks and boating off,
and on the shore. More or less rain
all through the day. One sail came in.
