

Remarks on board of Ship Mary from
Hills to the Island of Oahu

Thursday Nov 4 The first and middle
parts of these 24 hours light breezes
from N.W. to N. Employed in mending
and painting the boats. Strike ship
Alma of Edgworth. More insight
twenty miles distant. Lat by obs 20.53 N.

Friday Nov 5
These 24 hours light breeze and
calms from N.W. to N. Ship heading
N.E. to E. N.E. in one tack and on
the other N. by E. lat. N.W. The count
of wind bore per compass S.W. at 12 noon
We gammed with last Prime.
Lat by obs 20.53 N.

Saturday Nov 6 Throughout these 24
hours light airs and calms from N.W.
to N. N.E. heading N.W. to N. N.
Some 15 miles off to the Northward of former
ground for Oahu. Employed in mending
the starboard deck. Put the hole for the fire
time. Lat by obs 20.52 N.

Sunday Nov 7 Throughout this day
fine breezes from N. to East heading
N. Westaly for Oahu. Malaka some ten
miles to the Northward of S. Lat by obs 21.16 N.

Remarks on board of Ship Mary while
laying off and on the port of Honolulu (Oahu)

Monday Nov 8 This day at ten A.M.
Capt. took a boat and pulled for the harbor
of Honolulu 15 miles distant. At 12 noon
off Diamond Head with fair weather
It was the day a laying off and on
at Oahu.

Tuesday Nov 9
Throughout these 24 hours moderate
trade winds a laying off and on
at Oahu. The boat that went on shore
came off and took some Kanakas
on shore to be discharged.

Wednesday Nov 10
These 24 hours a laying off and on
at Oahu with moderate trade breezes.
Capt and third mate on shore.

Thursday Nov 11
These 24 hours a laying off and on
at Oahu with moderate N.E. trade
breezes. At 12 noon boat came off from
shore with provisions that was shipped

Friday Nov 12
These 24 hours a laying off and on
at Oahu with moderate trade breezes.

Saturday Nov 13
These 24 hours moderate trade breezes
a laying off and on at Oahu. Capt on shore
