

Remarks on board of Ship Navy while making
a passage to the Hawaiian Isles.

Sunday Jan 23. Throughout three
twenty four hours strong westerly
breeze At 2 P.M. furled the fore and
mizzen topsails. At 4 more moderate
set fore and mizzen topsails heading
N. to N. W. At 6 P.M. more ship heading
N. to E. Lat by obs 21.50 S.

Monday Jan 24. Throughout three
twenty four hours fresh breeze with
squalls from N. to N. W. First part heading
S. N. to S. W. by S. At 6 P.M. more ship
heading N. N. E. to S. under double reefed
topsails. At 7 A.M. more ship again heading
S. N. to N. by E. series more moderate
under whole topsails and gill. More weight
bearing per compass S. N. some 30 miles
distant. Lat by obs 21.56 S.
Long. Chron. 153.21. W.
Long. Land 156.11 W.

Tuesday Jan 25. Throughout three twenty
four hours moderate breeze from N. N. E. to N. E.
First part heading S. N. to N. W. At 8 P.M.
more ship heading N. N. E. to N. E. under single
sails. At 5 A.M. more ship and made sail steering
N. N. W. to S. W. along the North side of Marston for
Oahu. Lat by obs 21.40 S.

Wednesday Jan 26. 1853. Throughout
moderate easterly breeze heading for
Oahu. At 2 P.M. took a pilot and fasten
climber on in the harbor of Honolulu.
Moved the ship head and set in three
sails and washed the outside of the ship
and took some pipes on shore for water.

Thursday Jan 27. All hands employed
in breaking out the fore hole for shutes
and setting them up. E. wind.

Friday Jan 28. All hands employed
on board in setting up shutes. After
their work is done, part of the ship's
company goes on shore for the night.

Saturday Jan 29. All hands employed
on board in setting up pipes. E. wind
with a weather.

Sunday Jan 30. Nothing doing
on board of ship. Most of the
crew being on shore.

Monday Feb 1. All hands employed
in setting up pipes shutes and in getting out
the anchor.

Tuesday Feb 2. All hands employed
in setting up pipe shutes. First
the wind shifted to the west and the ship
steamed inward with the tide. The
one of the boat crew was discharged
on account of sickness.
