

Harbor of Honolulu Friday July 16. 1853.

All hands employed in filling pipes with salt water and in getting wood from shore and smoking ship. Two men sick.

Saturday July 17. All hands employed on board of ship in stowing casks and filling with salt water and washing outside of ship.

Sunday July 18. The most of the ships company on shore.

Monday July 19. All hands employed in filling casks with salt water. At 3 P.M. we moved ship a floating fish trade.

Tuesday July 20. All hands employed in getting off a raft of water and stowing it down.

Wednesday July 21. All hands on board a doing nothing of any consequence.

Thursday July 22. All hands employed in getting off a raft of water and stowing it down.

Friday July 23. All hands employed in getting off a raft of water and stowing it down and raising shooks, moving ship &c.

Saturday July 24. All hands employed on board ship in getting off water and stowing it down and setting up shooks &c.

Sunday July 25. The most of the ships company on shore. This morning.

Monday July 26. All hands employed on board ship in getting off a raft of water one ton of coal and stowing it.

Tuesday July 27. All hands employed in getting off a raft of water one ton of coal and stowing it.

Wednesday March 28. One watch on liberty. The other at work on the ship in getting supplies from shore.

Thursday March 29. One watch on liberty and the other employed in painting ship.

Friday March 30. One watch on liberty and the other employed in painting ship.

Saturday March 31. One watch on liberty and the other employed in painting ship.

Sunday March 1. One watch on liberty and the other employed in painting ship.

Monday March 2. One watch on liberty and the other employed in getting supplies from a schooner.

Tuesday March 3. One watch on liberty and the other employed on board of ship.
