hours light winds from N. to S.E. steering
N.N.E. Lat by obs 60.35 N.
Long. chron 171.00 E.

Friday May 20 Light air from S.E. to
N.W. heading N.E. by N. N. 7 A.M. we was
up to the ice. We spoke the ship a boiling
a right whale. Lat by obs 61.00 N.

Saturday May 21 Light air and calms
from Easterly a running along the ice.
Spoke ships Cornelius Nordland, Hannabell,
Gen. Scott, Jella. New England nothing this
season.

Sunday May 22 Fair and middle
parts calm. Middle and latter moderate
from S.W. to E.S.E. a backing to and fro
along the ice. Thirty sails insight.
Lat by obs 65.10 N.

Monday May 23 Fresh winds from
S.E. to E. Latter light air and calms
Ten sails insight. Lat by obs 65.70 N.
Long. chron 176.55 E.

Tuesday May 24 Throughout these 24
light air and calms with some fog.
Latter light winds from Eastward a heading.
Thirty sails insight Spoke the Rainbow clear.

Wednesday May 25 Light air and calms
from N.E. to S. a heading Easterly and
Westerly a running through the ice.

Thursday May 26 Winds from S.E.
to N.E. backing ship Easterly and Westerly
along the ice. Some twenty sails insight and
now a boiling. Lat by obs 61.52

Friday May 27 Moderate Easterly winds.
Thirty sails insight off deck and none of them
a boiling chasing cutting or anything in the
whaling business.

Saturday May 28 Winds from N.E. to N.
heading E.S.E. on one tack N.W. to W.N.W. on
the other. Cape Narvinn has been
insight the last 24 hours and a plenty of
ice. Some thirty sails a running along the ice
of it. Lat by obs 61.55 N.

Sunday May 29 Strong winds from N. to
N.N.E. a heading along the ice Latter thick fogs
under double reefed topsails.

Monday May 30 Fresh winds from N.N.E.
to N.E. under close reefed topsails a heading
N.W. to N.N.W. on one tack and E.W.E.S.E.
on the other. Spoke ship John of N.B. nothing
this season.

Tuesday June 1st Throughout these
twenty four hours moderate winds
from N. to N. steering N.E. by E. Lat by obs 62.15 N.
Long. chron 177.15 E.
