



Wednesday June 29. Fine weather
and moderate winds from N. West by
At 5 P.M. landed for whales and the
Capt took the larboard boat (the mate being
sick) and stowed but S. S. M. alongside. But
the time every thing was rigged for cutting
it was ten o'clock. Sent all hands below
At 2 A.M. called them again and commenced
cutting. By 12 noon clear decks and started
the work. So ends

Thursday June 30. Moderate winds
from West by heading to and from employed
in boiling. Several sails insight and one
a boiling.

Friday July 1st. Moderate winds from
Easterly and southerly heading from N. E.
to S. E. Spoke the Wm. Hamilton (one whale).
So ends the day a boiling.

Saturday July 2nd. Fresh southerly winds
with fair weather heading S. E. and W. under
double reefed topsails. Larboard watch coiled
down in the first watch. Sailed part all hands
employed in stowing down on starboard side of
main hatch. Lat by St. 62.55 N.

Sunday July 3rd. Moderate winds from
S. S. W. heading West by with thick fog

Monday July 4. Fine weather and variable
winds from S. W. to N. and S. Spoke the
Monongahela Bark Alice and the N. P. Tallmadge

Tuesday July 5. Fine weather and light
winds from S. to S. W. Under a plenty of ice
to the Northward and Westward. Two sails
insight. Lat by St. 63.04 N.

Wednesday July 6. Moderate winds
from S. to E. S. E. a heading Easterly and
Southward with some fog. Long. 179.55 E.

Thursday July 7. Fresh Easterly winds
a heading S. E. on one tack and N. on the
other under double reefed topsails. The most
of the time thick fog and hazy weather

Friday July 8. Moderate winds from
E. to S. E. First part a heading N. N. E.
Middle and latter E. by N. Sent down
the fore royal yard and fore top gallant yards
and mizzen top gall. mast.

Saturday July 9. Winds from Eastward
and N. N. E. a heading from S. E. to E. Thin
and rainy all day. Employed in binding
larboard chain and in getting the anchor
ready for use. Spoke the America three whales
