

Remarks on board of Ship Mary 1854

Sunday September 3. Light air and calm from S.E. a heading S.W. and  
Sat by the 54.25 N.

Monday September 4. Moderate winds from E.N.E. a steering S. by E. employed in sorting over the potatoes spoke the Nauticon of N. Bedford & whals Sat by the 55.31 N.  
Long by chron 144.50 E

Tuesday September 5. Light wind from E.N.E. to W a steering S.S.E. Sat by the 52.25 N.  
Long 150.15 E

Wednesday September 6. Light winds from Westward. Middle and latter parts from S.W. to S.E. a heading S.E. to E. At 10 A.M. looked for right whales. I.B. darted at one but master far off

Thursday September 7. Winds from S.W. and S.E. a heading E. and S.W. under double reefed topsails View two right whales

Friday September 8. Fresh gales from S.W. to E a heading E. S. E. to E on one tack and S. to S.W. on the other Looked for right whales but without success Sat by the 51.19 N.  
Long 150.10 E

Saturday September 9. Fresh winds from S. to S.W. a heading E. S. E. on one tack and S.W. to W. on the other Looked for right whales the I.B. darted at one but without success

Sunday September 10. Winds from S.W. to E a heading S.E. to W. S.W. View whales and looked but without success Sat by the 50.25 N.  
Long 150.21 E

Monday September 11. 1854. Moderate wind from S.W. to N. W. Latter part strong wind from S.W. to N. Middle part a heading N.W. to N. E. M. Looked for whales without success.

Tuesday September 12. Moderate winds from N. W. to N. a steering S.W. to S. N.

Wednesday September 13. Fresh gales from S.W. to N. W. First part a steering N.E. At 6 P.M. hove to a heading N. N. W. to S. At 6 A.M. a sea struck the fore boat and hove her. At 10 A.M. broke in and commenced repairing. Seized the day under double reefed topsails Sat by the 50.19 N.  
Long 153.17 E

Thursday September 14. Fresh wind from N. to N. W. a heading N. to N. N. W. View whales and looked for them without success. Employed in mending the fore boat Sat by the 51.19 N.

Friday September 15. Wind from Westward and Southward a heading N. to N. N. W. and S.E. to E. S. E. Looked once for whales but without success Sat by the 51.14 N.

Saturday September 16. Fresh gales from S. to S.E. a heading S.W. on one tack and E. to E. N. E. on the other

Sunday September 17. Fresh wind from S. to S.E. a heading N. to S.W. on one tack and E. to E. S. E. on the opposite Sat by the 51.12 N.
