

Honolulu Oct 29. 1854

Two barges from E. N. E. M. M. M. took a pilot and at 11 A. M. came to an anchor in Oahu harbor.

Monday Oct 30. All hands employed in bundling and drying bone.

Tuesday Oct 31. All hands employed in breaking out shooks and in cleaning up the fore hold for oil.

Wednesday Nov 1st. All hands employed in breaking out shooks and shoring casks and repairing the things on ship.

Thursday Nov 2. All hands employed in shoring cask and pumping fresh water.

Friday Nov 3. All hands employed in taking in and storing oil from ship Peter Star.

Saturday Nov 4. All hands employed in taking and storing oil from ship Peter Star.

Sunday Nov 5. Nothing doing on board. The ships company on shore.

Laying at anchor in Oahu harbor

Monday Nov 6. Discharged 15 men and got nine to work on board from shore.

Tuesday Nov 7. Employed in taking oil from ship Peter Star. At 4 P. M. the North Star of St. Vendouren arrived of ship party and broke the Spitsenil yard.

Wednesday Nov 8. Employed in taking oil from ship Peter Star. At 12 noon hauled from along side. Discharged two men. Eight men from shore to work on board some eight days and some of them ten.

Thursday Nov 9. Employed in taking bone from the Bark Harmony. Eight men to work from shore on board.

Friday Nov 10. This day a taking bone from bark Harmony. Shoring casks. Eight men on board at work from shore.

Saturday Nov 11. Taking bone from bark Harmony and bark Active. Eight men from shore to work on board.

Sunday Nov 12. This day most all hands on shore. Light rain all through the day.

Monday Nov 13. Taking bone from bark Active and painting ship outside.

Tuesday Nov 14. A painting ship. Four men from shore at work on board.
