Wednesday Nov 15. Rainy most all of the day. A getting a few potatoes from shore. Three men employed on board from shore.

Thursday Nov 16. Employed in painting ship &c with four men to work from shore.

Friday Nov 17. Employed in painting and storing oil water.

Saturday Nov 18. Employed in painting ship &c with fine weather. Three men to work on board from shore.

Sunday Nov 19. Fine weather. The most of the time P. Ship's company on shore.

Monday Nov 20. Watch on liberty. Men on board a painting. Shipped four men.

Tuesday Nov 21. This day employed in getting water from shore.

Wednesday Nov 22. Employed in storing water with a few men on board.

Thursday Nov 23. Employed in setting up rigging.

Friday Nov 24. This day @ getting ready for sea @ waiting for men.

Saturday Nov 25. All ready for sea & shipping men.

Sunday Nov 26. Watch on liberty.

Monday Nov 27. Hauled ship to the mouth of the passage all ready for sea & waiting for men.

Tuesday Nov 28. Some four men came in from the Rio came at 8 A.M. and stood out of the passage the pilot left us a laying off and on.

Wednesday Nov 29. This day commenced @ laying off and on with several other ships and strong trades. At 12 noon Capt. came on board with two men put ship off S. by E. with moderate wind from Eastward. Shipped sixteen men at Okla.

3. Thursday Nov 30. Moderate winds from Eastward a strong S. by E. Later light wind from S. N. to S. @ heading E. to E. S. E. on one tack and N. to S. on the opposite. Lat by obs 19.47 N.

4. Friday Dec 1. Light wind a heading E. S. E. and N. S. W. Middle part moderate from S. E. a heading S. N. Later part fresh from E. to E. N. E. a heading S. E. to S. E. by S. employed in mending jib and putting preserver guns on jib boom. Lat by obs 17.41 N.

5. Saturday Dec 2. Fresh winds from E. to E. by N. a heading from S. E. to S. by E. Lat by obs 15.17 N.
