

Log of Whaling Ship Nellie F. Putnam of

Wednesday Jan 22^d

Comes in with light Trades & pleasant weather, heaved down the Masts & Oiled the Booms over again, Middle part frequent squalls of rain latter part pleasant weather All hands employed bending sails took on board a lot of Yams, two cans of white Lard two cans of black lard one bundle of Hoop Iron

Thursday 23^d

Comes in with pleasant weather All hands employed bending sails &c Middle part passing rainsqualls latter part good weather All hands employed at various jobs

Friday 24^d

Comes in with light Trades & pleasant weather Middle & latter parts the same to day William Colored Seaman deserted

Saturday January 25^d

Comes in with moderate trades & pleasant weather at 8h got under way and steered W under Foresail & Jib Middle part light breezes latter part moderate & pleasant at 12h set Mainsail & Jib. the Island of St Vincent in sight ahead at 22h came to an Anchor in Kingston harbor in 8 fathoms water Starboard Anchor veered to 30 fathoms chain

Sunday 26^d

Comes in with moderate trades and pleasant weather Middle & latter parts much the same Shipd a colored Seaman of name John Bebbitt

Monday 27^d

Comes in with moderate trades & occasional rainsqualls at 1h got under way & steered out of the bay under all lower sails at 2.30 came to an Anchor in Bookama bay furled the sails & commenced getting off water latter part all hands employed getting off water at noon, having taken off 90 bbls, got under way & steered for Bequa
