

Log of whaling ship Kellie T. Putnam

Saturday February 22^d

Came in with brisk breezes & squally weather at 1h30 came to an anchor in Negeva bay in 100 fathoms water dropped astern & veered to fifteen fathoms chain part anchor, & furled the sails Middle & latter parts pleasant weather

Sunday 23^d

Came in with pleasant weather At 19h got under way and stood out into Mustique Channel Saw Humpbacks & lowered the boats in chase at noon starboard boat struck one but the fore broke and we lost him took the boat up.

Monday 24^d

Came in with moderate trades at 1h saw a whale & lowered for him but did not succeed in getting on. At 2h he came to an anchor in the upper bay of Mustique & boiled out the blackfish at 3h he got under way. saw two whales & lowered for them they were going quick to windward

Tuesday February 25^d

270 days out
Came in with light trades & pleasant weather At 3h came to an anchor in Bullasse roads in 3 fathoms water veered to 12 fathoms latter part rainy weather

Wednesday 26^d

Came in with light winds & good weather saw whales & lowered for them in company with the J. H. Philips boats. got none returned on board latter part good weather. at 19h got under way & stood out into the channel saw whales lowered the boats but did not get on to them

Thursday 27^d

Came in with good weather at 1h he came to an anchor in Kingston roads at Vincent in 10 fathoms water part anchor veered to 25 fathoms & furled the sails latter part good weather. at 2h he got under way & stood over to Mustique at noon took the boat up & stood out into the channel
