

Log of Whaling Schooner Nellie J Putnam of

Wednesday March 4th

Comes in with moderate trades & good weather. Our provisions having arrived here from Barbados see that them on board

viz, 12 bbls Flour & 8 bbls Beef

2 bbls Pork 1 bbl Beans 2 Kegs Butter

At 4^h hrs got under way & stood over to Bequia where we anchored & furled the sails, latter part brisk trades & pleasant weather. got off a load of broom stuff

Thursday 5th

Comes in with moderate trades & good weather. Tared down the head stays. At 1^h got under way & stood out into the Channel. Saw whales & lowered for them both boats got near enough to dart but to far off to fasten

Friday March 5th

Comes in with light trades at 2^h hrs came to an anchor in company with the Jason Taylor in the upper bay of Mustique saw whales and lowered for them but did not get on at 1^h got under way, saw some whales going quick but did not lower for them

Saturday 7th

Comes in with light trades & good weather saw blackfish & lowered for them but did not get on. stood over to town & got our letters at 5^h hrs came to an anchor in Bequia harbor & furled the sails Middle part squally with rain, Latter part brisk trades, at 1^h got under way & worked up Friendship bay & out into the Channel saw whales & lowered for them but did not get on
