Came in with very light winds from W & S.W. Sch. heading to S.W. a heavy swell heaving from S latter part pleasant weather made sail at 2 o'clock spoke Sch. Emporium & Sch. J. Taylor

Sch. steering to E & E Middle part Sch. under full foresail & topsail wind from S.W. at 19 h Lat mainsail & jib weather very squally at 20 h saw a school of sperm whales cows & calves both boats got fast. Starboard boats line parted or was accidentally cut. at 23 h took the Starboard boats whale to the Sch. & got ready to cut. weather very threatening. threaten lightning & Rain
