

Monday the 6th January 1845

First part light air & pleasant weather still in company with the Delahos saw black fish Mid Part light air saw a ship pass handy to us Lat part spoke the George of Fairhaven 3 1/2 months out with 70 bbls of sp oil the Capt went on board so ends
Lat 42-21 S

Tuesday the 7th

First part pleasant weather saw black fish lowered the Starboard boat got one Mid Part gaming with the George and with the Citizen of Wintichet 4 1/2 months out with 30 bbls of Whale oil Lat part fresh gales the George & Citizen in sight so ends this Day in Lat 42-21 S
Long 74-51 W

Wednesday the 8th

First part fresh gales & pleasant weather saw black fish lowered without success Mid part fresh breezes double upon the fore top sail & took one reef in the Mizzen top sail Lat part let the reys out of the fore Top sail & set the main top galant sail saw finbacks so ends this Day in Lat 42-20 S Long

Thursday the 9th

First part fresh gales from S S E ship heading S W by W per compass the watch employed at ships duty at 6 o'clock double reefed the top sails Mid part fresh gales Lat part the watch employed at ships duty steering W E by W so ends this Day in Lat 42-20 S

Friday the 10th

First part light winds from S S E and pleasant weather steering W S E the land on our starboard beam the watch employed at ships duty saw porpoises Mid part light wind from the N Lat part the same the watch employed in brack ing out shooks & boiling black fish so ends this Day Lat 41-48 S

Saturday the 11th January 1845

First part fresh gales from the S double reefed the fore topsail & put one reef in the mizzen saw black fish stowed off the fore hole broke out flour ship heading W by S at 4 o'clock veered ship heading S E by E Mid part fresh breezes Lat part started water turned the reys out of the top sails filled some cask in the fore hole with salt water so ends

Sunday the 12th

First part fresh gales from S S W at 6 o'clock double reefed the top sails Mid part light air from S S E Lat part let the reys out of the top sails fresh gales from the S the land in sight so ends this Day in Lat 42-11 S

Monday the 13th

First part fresh breezes from S & pleasant weather Mid part fresh gales double reef the top sails at 4-30 let out the reys & set the main sail Lat part light wind & pleasant weather set the main & top galant sail employed at setting up shooks for water saw the land so ends this day in Lat 42-14 S

Tuesday the 14th

First part light breezes from the S & pleasant weather heading towards the land the cooper employed at setting up shooks at 2 were ship heading off shore Mid part took in the main top galant sail & reefed the top sails the ship heading W S W by the wind larboard tacks aboard Lat part employed in filling some cask with salt water in the main hole the cooper employed at setting up shooks so ends this Day in Lat 41-59 S

Wednesday the 15th

First part light winds from the W S W W employed at straining oil in the main hole a sail in sight to windward steering N mid part thick wet weather such as scotch mist Lat part employed at starting water so ends this day
