March 1845

Wednesday the 26th

First Part light winds from the NW ship heading NW E employed at ships duty Massachusetts in sight bearing NW E Mid Part nothing of note Lat Part fresh breezes spoke the ship Niagara of New York 4 months out with 40 bbls of sperm oil one boat went fishing at meridian the fishing boat returned & ends this Day Miss A E D Miss C M A

Thursday the 27th

First Part fresh breezes from NW ship heading NW E sailing with the A. Nelson & twisted her at that Mid Part nothing of note Lat Part strong breezes some rain so ends this Day no observation

Friday the 28th

First Part light winds from the southward saw black-fish lowered & took one Mid Part light air Lat Part the same employed at ships duty so ends this Day

Saturday the 29th First Part light winds from the E seeing AWP by A employed at ships duty Mid Part strong breeze from the NW Lat the same steering NW at meridian spoke the ship General Scott of New-Haven 14 months out with 1050 bbls of sperm oil overed ship to the NW E so ends this Day

Sunday the 30th

First Part fresh breezes from the NW in company with the Gen Scott Mid Part light winds Lat Part the same so ends this Day

Monday the 31st

First Part light winds from the westward Mid Part the same Lat Part light winds from S E ship heading S WP employed at repairing the main top sail so ends this Day Miss A E D Miss C M A

So ends March 1845

April 1845

Tuesday the 1st

First Part light winds from S E ship heading S WP employed at ships duty Mid Part nothing of note Lat Part light winds from the southward & pleasant weather employed at repairing the main sail so ends this Day Miss C M A Miss A E D

Wednesday the 2^d

First Part light winds from S E ship heading S WP employed at repairing the main sail a ship in sight & Massachusetts Lat Part light winds from the NW 2 sails in sight so ends this Day Miss A E D Miss C M A

Thursday the 3^d

First Part light winds from the NW 3 sails in sight spoke 2 of them the Elizabeth of Salem Capt. Hall the other was the Barque Alfred Tyler of Edgartown Capt. Luce 5 months out with 70 bbls of sperm oil the Elizabeth 3 1/2 months out clean Mid Part fresh breezes Lat Part strong winds 2 sails in sight so ends this Day
