

Remarks on board Bound to the North
April 1845

Tuesday the 22th

Commenced with light airs from the S.E. and pleasant weather Ship steering N.W. by W all sail set. Employed at various jobs of Ship's duty. Cooper Employed making line tubs calculate to have two lines in each boat. Mid & Latter Part calm Employed making preparation for setting studding sails to ends

Lat 27-45 S Long 76-21 W

Wednesday the 23th

First Part light airs from the S.E. and pleasant steering W.N.W. set the Main topgallant & fore topmast studding sails set Larboard & Starboard Watches Mid & Latter Part the same so ends this Day in Lat 26 36 Long 78-18

Thursday the 24th

First Part fresh breezes from the S.E. steering W.N.W. by W all sail set at 2 P.M. saw the island of St. Felix bearing W.N.W. at 5 lowered a boat & went fishing at 6-30 the boat returned with some fish luffed to the wind & shortened sail Mid Part at 8 o'clock squared in the yard & steered N.E. Lat Part made sail & steered W.N.W. & so ends this Day Lat 25-17 Long 77-32

Friday the 25th

First Part light winds all sail set course N by E Mid & Lat Parts the same employed at ships duty so ends this Day Lat 22 35

Saturday the 26th

First Part light winds from the S.E. course N by E Mid Part the same Lat Part steering N by E so ends this Day

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Sunday the 27th

First Part calm saw black fish Mid Part variable winds with some rain Lat Part calm pleasant weather so ends this Day no obs

Monday the 28th

First Part light winds from the S.E. steering N by E with rain Mid Part light variable winds Lat Part light wind from the S.E. employed at various jobs of ships duty so ends this Day Lat 19-03 Long 76-37

Tuesday the 29th

First Part light winds & pleasant weather steering N by E saw a fin back whale Mid & Lat nothing of note so ends this Day Lat 15-31 75-43

Wednesday the 30th

First Part light trade winds steering N by E employed at ships duty Mid Part course N.W. by W Lat Part N by E & ends this Day Lat 13-05 Long 76-22

May 1845

Thursday the 1st

First Part fresh breezes course N by E saw hump backs & black fish took one black fish sent the Mizzen Royal mast & yard aloft Mid Part at 1 shortened sail & luffed to the wind with the main top-sail aback heading to the Westward at 1 veered ship heading to the Eastward at 6 made sail Lat Part light wind & foggy saw black & hump backs lowered one boat without success employed at various jobs of ships duty so ends this Day No observation

Ship N.E. P
