

## Remarks on Board

July 1845

Wednesday the 23<sup>rd</sup>

First Part strong gales ship heading to the southward under double reef<sup>d</sup> top sails the watch employed at various jobs setting up the fore top mast rigging at sun down furled the main sail mid Part squally weather Lat Part at 6 PM at the main rail & veered ship heading to the Eastward so ends this Day Ships A & B Lat 6 42 S Long 108-33 W

Thursday the 24<sup>th</sup>

First Part strong gales ship heading to the Eastward the watch employed at various jobs of ships duty Mid Part nothing of note Lat Part saw whales off the weather beam going to the westward made several tacks to weather them but without success so ends this Day Lat 5-38

Friday the 25<sup>th</sup>

First Part light winds ship heading to the southward the watch employed at stowing oil between deck mid & Lat Parts squally weather so ends this Day Lat 6-16 South

Saturday the 26<sup>th</sup>

First Part employed at wetting hole & washing ship

Sunday the 27<sup>th</sup>

First Part employed as above Lat Part at 6 AM saw sperm whales lowered 4 boats the low boat got fast at 11 took the whale to the ship the boats went off again in pursuit of the whales so ends this Day in Lat of whale

## Remarks on Board

July 1845

Monday the 28<sup>th</sup>

First Part the boat off after the whales at 5 PM the boats returned to the ship prepared for cutting Lat Part employed at cutting at 11-30 finished so ends this Day Lat 5-04 Long 104-08

Tuesday the 29<sup>th</sup>

First Part employed at bailing care cutting junk & commenced bailing Mid & Lat Parts employed at bailing ship heading to the Northward with a strong breeze so ends this Day Lat 6-07

Wednesday the 30<sup>th</sup>

First & Mid Parts employed at bailing at 5 PM finished Lat Part washed off decks &c so ends this Day Lat 5-34 S

Thursday the 31<sup>st</sup>

First Part light winds ship heading to the southward Mid Part light rain squalls Lat fresh gales with rain squalls ship heading to the Eastward the watch employed at various jobs of ships duty so ends this Day Ships A & B in Lat 6-40 South

August 1845

Friday the 1<sup>st</sup>

First Part fresh gales ship heading to the Eastward under double reef<sup>d</sup> top sails the watch employed at various jobs of ships duty Lat Part the watch employed at repairing the fore sail strong breeze so ends this Day Lat 5-40 South

Saturday the 2<sup>nd</sup>

First Part light winds ship heading to the Eastward the watch employed as above Lat Part raised Whales the West boat got one the starboard boat got fast to another set him to yawning blood took the line & off he went so ends this Day
