

Remarks on Board

September 1845

Wednesday the 4th

First Part strong breeze & cloudy weather ship under double reefed top sails heading to the Eastward employed in bailing Mid & Lat Parts much the same so ends this Day in Lat 6-57 South Long 103-17 West

Thursday the 5th

First Part fresh breeze employed as above Mid Part at 10 o'clock finish bailing Lat Part at Day light set the mainsail & turned the reef out of the top sails so ends this Day in Lat 6-13 South

Friday the 6th

First Part fresh gales ship under top sails & courses heading N E by the wind Mid & Lat Parts the same so ends this Day in Lat 4-48 S

Saturday the 7th

First Part light wind & pleasant weather ship heading to the Eastward under all sail Mid & Lat Parts the same so ends this Day in Lat 3-23 S Long 101-25 W

Sunday the 8th

First Part light winds & pleasant weather & smooth sea ship under all sail Mid Part the same Lat Part the watch employed in coopers oil so ends this Day in Lat 2-41 S

Monday the 9th

This Day commences as yesterday Mid Part light winds Lat Part the same all hands employed in stowing oil in the fore hold so ends this Day in Lat 1-13 South

Miles N E D

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September 1845

Wednesday the 10th

First Part light winds & pleasant weather ship heading to the Eastward under all sail all hands employed in stowing down oil Lat Part employed as above so ends this Day in Lat 40 miles south

Thursday the 11th

First Part light winds & pleasant weather all hands employed in stowing oil in the fore hold Lat Part employed in washing ship so ends this Day in Lat 28 South Long 94-24

Friday the 12th

First Part light winds & pleasant weather the watch employed in washing ship Lat Part employed in washing ship & breaking out shoes saw several fin backs so ends this Day in Lat of hard labor

Saturday the 13th

First Part light winds with light rain squalls employed as above Lat Part employed in ship duty so ends this Day in Lat 8 miles south

Sunday the 14th

First Part fresh gales employed in ship duty saw several fin backs Mid & Lat Parts strong breeze so ends this Day in Lat 23 Long 91-11

Monday the 15th

First Part fresh gales at 5-30 saw Albemarle at 6 took in the flying jib & main top ghest sail Mid Part light winds & calms with rain Lat Part at 6 AM saw the rock redondo bearing N E saw the North head bearing E N E at 7 saw a ship off the weather beam at 8 she spoke us it proved to be the Sloop of New Bedford 10th out with 300 bbls sperm oil our Cooper employed in setting up shoes so ends this Day
