

93 Remarks on Board on the off shore ground  
Doranda 1845

Saturday the 6<sup>th</sup>

First Part light winds & pleasant weather ship heading to the Eastward all hands employed in stowing off the main hole washing decks &c Lat Part the watch employed in various jobs of ships duty so ends this Day Lat 1-41

Sunday the 7<sup>th</sup>

First Part light winds & pleasant weather ship heading to the Eastward the watch employed in ships duty Lat Part nothing of Note so ends this Day Ship W.C.P. in Lat 50-27S Long 98-50 W

Monday the 8<sup>th</sup>

First Part light winds & pleasant weather ship heading to the Eastward Mid & Late Parts much the same so ends this Day in Lat 10-16 SP

Tuesday the 9<sup>th</sup>

First Part fresh gale ship heading to the Southward the watch employed in ships duty Mid & Late Parts Nothing of Note so ends this Day Lat 10-45 South

Wednesday the 10<sup>th</sup>

First Part fresh gale ship heading S.W. the watch employed in repairing the flying jib saw 14 fin back Lat Part employed in various jobs of ship duty so ends this Day Lat 2-06 Long 102-26

Thursday the 11<sup>th</sup>

First Part fresh breezes ship heading S.W. saw sulphur bottoms Lat Part saw fin back the watch employed in ships duty so ends this Day Lat 3-37 Long 102-55

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December 1845

Friday the 12<sup>th</sup>

First Part fresh gale ship heading to the southward the watch employed in ships duty Lat Part the same 2 ships in sight so ends this Day in Lat 5-08

Saturday the 13<sup>th</sup>

First Part light winds & clear weather the watch employed in ship duty ship heading to the southward at 4 P.M. spoke the Marjane Equator of New Bedford 26 months out with 900 bbl of sperm oil Mid Part gaming with the Equator Lat Part light winds ship heading to the Eastward the watch employed in ship duty so ends this Day in Lat 5-24 South

Sunday the 14<sup>th</sup>

First Part light winds & pleasant weather ship heading to the Eastward one sail in sight at 8 o'clock spoke her it proved to be the ship President of Nantucket 56 months out with 1000 of sperm oil Lat Part fresh breezes so ends this Day Lat 4-24

Monday the 15<sup>th</sup>

First Part light winds ship heading to the Eastward at sundown shortened sail & veered ship heading N.W. by the wind Mid Part the same Lat Part the watch employed in ships duty so ends this Day Ship W.C.P. in Lat 5-12 Long 104-30

Tuesday the 16<sup>th</sup>

First Part light winds & pleasant weather ship heading to the Southward under all sail at sundown shortened sail Lat Part nothing of Note so ends this Day in Lat 5-36 South
