

105 Remarks on Board on the Line
February 1846

Sunday the 8th

Commences with fresh breezes & pleasant weather ship heading to the southward by the wind saw white water to the leeward ran for it a while saw no more of it luffed to the wind again the watch employed in various jobs of ships duty Mid Part at 8 o'clock veered ship heading to the N.E.

Lat Part nothing of Note so ends this Day
Miles N.E. & P. on Lat 58 miles
Miles S.W. & P. Long 120-15 W

Monday the 9th

Commences with light winds & pleasant weather ship heading to the N.E. by the wind at sundown veered ship & shortened sail Mid Part at 12 o'clock veered ship Lat Part the watch employed in fitting the bar stays & mizzen stay &c so ends this Day Lat

Tuesday the 10th

Commences with light winds & pleasant weather ship by the wind all sail set heading N.E. Employed at various jobs of ships duty Saw Black fish & Fin backs Mid Part steering West & Latter Part steering S.W. employed on ships duty so ends this Day Miles N.E. & P. Lat 55-58

Wednesday the 11th

Commences with light winds & pleasant weather steering S.W. Mid & Lat ship by the wind heading to the southward so ends this Day Lat 58 miles south

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Thursday the 12th

Commences with light winds & fine weather ship heading to the southward employed in ships duty Mid & Lat Part strong breezes ship heading S.W. & P. Lat 2-20

Friday the 12th

Commences with light winds & clear weather ship heading S.W. by the wind the watch employed in ships duty Lat Part steering N.W. & P. so ends this Day Miles N.E. & P. Lat 3-20 south Long 125-10

Saturday the 13th

Commences with fresh breezes steering N.W. Mid Part the same Lat Part light winds so ends this Day Lat 1-46

Sunday the 14th

Commences with light winds & fine weather steering N.W. spoke the Peruvian of Nantucket 16 months out with 200 lbs of sperm oil Mid & Lat Part ships course the same so ends this Day Lat 44 miles Long 125-44 W

Monday the 15th

Commences with light winds & fine weather steering N.W. at sundown took in the light sails hauled up the courses & luffed to wind heading N.W. & P. Lat Part employed on ships duty so ends this Day Lat 13 miles N.W.

Tuesday the 16th

Commences with fresh breezes steering S.W. at sundown luffed to the wind heading S. Mid & Lat much the same so ends this Day Lat 1-06 south Long 127-23
