

Remarks on Board at the Islands
April 1846

Saturday the 4th

Commences with light winds of E steering W
bent the cables Mid. Part light winds from the Westward
& calm. Latter Part light winds from the W
at 9 AM raised Ensign bearing W S W 6 ships in
sight so ends this Day. Lat 19-51

Sunday the 5th

Commences with light winds from W by N
employed in beating to windward at 4 PM the wind
W by E at 6 the winds W W E Middle Part at 12
PM ship by the wind heading W W Lat Part steering
various course so ends this Day more in sight W W by N

Monday the 6th

Commences with fresh gales & thick weather Mid. Part
steering W W at 1 o'clock tuffed to the wind bearing
W W W with the main top sail aback at daylight
kept away W by S the land in sight to the Southward
through the fog 4 ships in sight at 11-30 anchored
in the Port of Lahina in 15 fathoms of water so
ends this Day

Tuesday the 7th

Commences with light winds in the harbour
40 ships in and coming & going continually
at 2 PM the Capt. & boats crew went ashore
at 6-30 came on board Lat Part at 8 AM got
under weigh & sailed better in shore
anchored in 15 fathoms of water at 10 AM the
starboard watch went ashore on liberty the Larboard
watch employed in hoisting out & repairing water
cask & carried a sick man ashore to
the Hospital so ends this Day

Remarks on Board laying at Anchor at Lahina
April 1846

Wednesday the 8th

Commences with strong breezes the starboard watch
ashore on liberty the Larboard watch employed in
ships duty at 6 o'clock the watch came on board
Lat Part the Larboard watch ashore on liberty the starboard
watch employed in ships duty so ends the Day

Thursday the 9th

First Part the Larboard watch ashore on liberty the
starboard watch employed in taking water on board
Lat Part one watch ashore the other on liberty so ends
this day

Friday the 10th

These 24 hours commences as yesterday and ends
the same

Saturday the 11th

These 24 hours commences as yesterday
the watch employed in harbour duty

Sunday the 12th

these 24 hours the same as yesterday

Monday the 13th

These 24 hours much the same

Tuesday the 14th

These 24 the same

Wednesday the 15th

First Part the Larboard watch ashore on liberty
Latter Part all hands employed in getting ready for
sea so ends this Day
