

North West Coast.

Thursday June 4th 1846

Began with moderate wind from the South. Employed in boiling one ship and a barge, to the windward. Middle part about the same still boiling. Lat. part finished boiling. lowered the boats for a whale without success. Lat 53° 56' N

Friday June 5th

Began with light wind lowered the boats again and struck and the boat moved. at 2 P.M. lowered again and struck a large whale. The whale sounded and ran to the windward and soon broke and one boat out and parted the short work. (hard luck) Middle part moderate wind. Lat part at 3 am. lowered for whales. at 9 am lowered again and soon struck a big whale to kill. So End.



Saturday June 6th

Began with fresh gale from the S.W. The boat still fast to the above mentioned whale. at 10 P.M. succeeded in killing the whale took him to the ship and made him fast for the night. Latter part employed in cutting. Lat 54° 02' N.

Sunday June 7th

Began with strong wind from the S.W. Employed in cutting. at 9 P.M. finished cutting and fished the fore and main-top sails and double reefed the main-top-sail. Middle & Latter part employed on boiling. Two ships in sight. Lat 54° 01' N. Long.

Monday June 8th

Began with strong wind from the S.W. At 4 P.M. lowered for a whale. the ship Hutteroffload in pursuit of the same whale. Middle part a heavy gale from the S.W. At 2 P.M. coiled down the work it being too rough to toil. Lat part the ship lying to under close sail.

Of America.

Tuesday June 9th 1846

Began with a heavy gale from the S.W. the ship lying to with the main-top-sail furled. Middle part more moderate. set the main-top-sail and fore-sail, & commenced boiling again. Latter part strong wind from the S.W.

Wednesday June 10th

Began with strong gale from the S.W. employed in boiling. One ship in sight to the leeward. Middle & Latter part about the same at 12 M finished boiling.

Thursday June 11th

Began at above mentioned. Ship with the fore-sail & main-top-sail set. Middle part strong wind from the S.W. employed in (Lat part) stowing oil in the fore-hold.

Friday June 12th

Began with strong gale from the S.W. Employed in stowing oil in the fore-hold. Middle part the same. Latter part more moderate.

Saturday June 13th

Began with moderate wind from the South. Employed in stowing down oil. Middle part about the same. Latter part light wind from the East steering to the South, lowered the boat for whales. So Ends. Lat 53° 05' N. Long 144° 10' West

Sunday June 14th

Began with a light wind from the E and a thick fog. at 1 P.M. saw a plenty of whales, to take in lower. Middle part foggy. Latter much the same. Made sail ship heading to the Northward. So Ends. Lat 53° 02' N.
