

Cruising on the

Tuesday July 7th 1846

Begins with moderate wind from the Westward & foggy. Middle & Latter part about the same. Latter part of N.E. Lat 52.23 North

Wednesday July 8th

Begins with light wind from the Westward & foggy. Passed a whale carcass. Middle part light wind. Latter part strong wind from the E. Lat 52.48 N Long 145.41 W

Thursday July 9th

Begins with a heavy gale from the E. N.E. & rainy. Employed in taking in sail. the ship lying to. at 5 P.M. saw a Blague steering to the Westward. supposed to be a Frenchman. Middle & Latter part strong gale & thick weather.

Friday July 10th

Begins with a strong gale from the N.E. saw a cow whale and a calf. lowered the boats at 4. and killed them both. at 10. took the whale to the ship and were obliged to let the calf go. it being too late to get him to the ship. Middle part light wind & a heavy sea running from the N.W. Latter part Employed in cutting.



Saturday July 11th

Begins with moderate wind from the N. Employed in cutting. At half past 3 P.M. finished cutting. did not start the work. Middle part light wind & foggy. Latter part moderate wind from the N.N.W. steering to the S.E.

Sunday July 12th

Begins with light wind from the N.N.W. steering to the S.E. Employed in mending the bow boat. at 3 P.M. stopped by the wind. Middle & Latter part strong wind from the Westward. Lat 51.28 N.

N.W. Coast of America.

Monday July 13th 1846

Begins with strong wind from the N.W. & foggy. Ship under double reefed top sails. Middle part about the same. Latter part Employed in boiling. Lat 51.08 N Long 146.19.15 W.

Tuesday July 14th

Begins with strong wind from the W. & thick weather. Employed in boiling. at 6 took in sail for the night. Middle & Latter part the same. Lat 51.51 N

Wednesday July 15th

Begins with heavy wind from the N.W. & foggy. Employed in boiling. Middle part inside offing. Latter part strong wind from the W. spoke the ship Bart Goddard. had got one whale since we saw her last. Lat 52.58 N, Long 146.56 W.

Thursday July 16th

Begins with heavy wind from the W. & clear. sitting in sight. Middle part about the same. Latter part light wind from the W. steering to the N.E.

Friday July 17th

Begins with light wind from the W. & foggy steering to the N.E. Middle & Latter part the same.

Saturday July 18th

Begins with light wind from the W. & foggy steering to the N.E. at 3 P.M. the fog lifted & we saw a dead whale took him to the ship. & cut him in. Imagine our surprise at finding it to be the calf that we left a week ago. at 7 P.M. a boat boarded us from the ship Elizabeth of N.B. taking one whale to kill. Middle & Latter part light wind from the W.
