

Cruiding on the N.W. Coast.

Sunday July 19th 1846
Began with light wind from the S.W. steering to the E. at 6 P.M. luffed by the wind & shortened sail. Latter part strong wind from the Westward steering to the N.N.E. one ship in sight steering the same course. Lat 50° 10' N. Long 143° 38' W.

Monday July 20th
Began with strong wind from the W. steering to the N.N.E. Middle & Latter part much the same.

Tuesday July 21st
Began with moderate wind from the W. at 2 P.M. spoke the ship Carolina of N.C. 11 miles out with 200 Bbls. Mid & Lat part steering to the North with all sail set.

Wednesday July 22nd
Began with moderate wind from the W. by N. ship Carolina in sight. Mid part much the same Lat part tacked a ship to the.

Thursday July 23rd
Began with strong breeze from the S.W. nothing in sight. Mid & Latter part foggy. Lat 50° 10' N. Long 143° 10' W.

Friday July 24th
Strong wind from the S.W. & foggy. saw a dead whale. Middle & Latter part moderate wind. Spoke the Barque Caroline of New York. had got four whale.

Saturday July 25th
Began with moderate wind from the S. ship with all sail set steering to the Westward. Middle & Latter part the same.

Sunday July 26th 1846
Began with strong wind from the S.W. ship with all sail set steering to the S.W. Middle part much the same.

Monday July 27th
Began with strong wind from the S.W. ship with all sail trying to get to the westward, where we think we will find some whales. for I am almost discouraged. Lat part a heavy gale. the ship lagging to.

Tuesday July 28th
Strong gale from the S.W. Middle part moderate Latter part light wind & foggy. steering to the S.W.

Wednesday July 29th
Began with moderate wind & foggy. heading to the S.W. Middle & Latter part much the same.

Thursday July 30th
Began with light wind & foggy. Middle part much the same. at 5 A.M. saw a whale off the lee beam. about two miles dist. lowered the boat & soon struck the starboard boat got badly stove, caused by the larvis being foul. So I. Lat 49° 35' N.

Friday July 31st
Began with moderate wind from the S.W. Employed in cutting. at dark lashed down for the night, and shortened sail Latter part finished cutting. Lat.



Saturday August 1st 1846
Began with moderate wind from the S.W. & haze. Employed in looking & steering to the S.W. Latter part much the same. Employed in stowing down oil in the after hold.
