

Steering towards the

Sunday August 2nd 1846

Came with moderate wind & thick weather steering to the S.E. Employed in hauling and stowing down oil, Middle & Latter part steering to the S.E. No Ob.

Monday August 3rd

Came with moderate wind from the S.W. Employed in hauling steering to the S.E. with all sail set, steering to the S.E. Middle Part fine Latter Part much the same. So Ends. Lat 32° 16' N. Long 149° 10' W.

Tuesday August 4th

Begins with light winds from the S.W. & perfectly clear weather. Ship under full sail steering to the South. Latter part much the same Lat 31° 42' N.

Wednesday August 5th

Came with moderate wind from the S.W. steering to the S.E. with all sail set. Employed in stowing down oil in the after hold. Middle & Latter part much the same. No Ob.

Thursday August 6th

Came with strong wind from the W and cloudy steering to the S.E. Employed in stowing down oil, Middle & Latter part much the same. Lat 31° 40' N.

Friday August 7th

Begins the same as yesterday finished stowing down oil Latter part strong wind ship with the main royal set - steering to the S.E. Lat 34° 50' N. Long 151° 39' W.

Saturday August 8th

Came as yesterday. Employed in washing ship set the fore top, mast, & set the main top. gallant studding sails. Middle & Latter part much the same. Lat 32° 01' N Long 153° 45' W.

Sandwich Islands.

Sunday August 9th 1846

Came with strong wind from the S.E. Employed in setting up shrouds, and washing ship outside, at 4 P.M. took in the studding sails Middle & Latter Parts steering S so ends this day Lat 32° 06' North

Long 153° 08' by Chronometer

Monday the 10th

Came with light winds from the E steering S the watch employed in various jobs of ship duty mid of Latter Parts much the same so ends in Lat 27° 00' N

Long 153° 54' by Lunar

Tuesday the 11th

Came with light winds from E by S frequent rain squalls steering S by E mid Part much the same Latter Part at 6 P.M. set the studding sails the watch employed in ships duty so end in Lat 24° 56'

Wednesday the 12th

Came with light winds from E N.E. steering south by W N.W. Middle Part the same Latter Part fresh breeze from the N.E. the carpenter & cooper employed in repairing A boat ship under all sail so ends this Day in Lat 21° 45' North

Long 155° 45' West

Thursday the 13th

Begins with fresh breeze from the N.E. steering S by W at 4 P.M. raised W. Mance bearing S.S.W. at 1.30 shorted sail & heeled to the wind with the main yard aback off the passage at 5 in the morning kept away for Port so ends this Day
