

Remarks on Board Bound to the Coast of Chili
September 1846

Friday the 11th

Commences with light winds from the North steering S & E the watch employed in bracing out for Reef Pole & Bitter Middle Part frequent rain squalls Latter Part light winds from N to E & here & there a drop of rain so ends No observation

Saturday the 12th

Commences with light winds from the N & E & plenty of rain steering S Middle Part much the same Latter Part light winds from the S & E ship heading to the S S W the watch employed in various jobs of ships duty so ends
Lat 10° 04'

Sunday the 13th

First Part fresh S & E trades at 6 P M took in the fore & mizen royal Middle Part strong winds at 11 o'clock took in the main royal & fore & mizen top galant-sails at 2 set the fore-top galant-sail parted the sheets & took it in again at 6 set the mizen top galant-sail so ends these 24 hours Lat 12° 30'

Monday the 14th

Commences with strong winds ship heading S S W at 6 o'clock set the fore-top galant-sail Lat Part ship heading S by W the watch employed in starting water bracing out for Sea sent down the main-royal-yard so ends Long 161° 52' Lat 14° 47' Boat

Tuesday the 15th

First Part fresh breezes the ship heading S by W the watch employed in fitting the main royal-yard & repairing the royal Middle & Latter Parts light winds so ends this Day
Lat 17° 57' south
Long 163° 01' West

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Wednesday the 16th

First Part light winds & pleasant weather ship heading S S W the watch employ in fitting rigging at 3 P M saw Palmyra Island situated in Latitude 18° 00' S Long 162° 07' West passed about 6 miles to the Westward of it saw it was covered with coconut trees Middle Part light winds Latter Part fresh breezes accompanied with rain ship heading S W by S so ends
Ship S E P No observation

Thursday the 17th

Commences with strong breezes from the S & E ship heading S S W the watch employed in ships duty Latter Part fresh breezes & cloudy the watch employed in repairing the mizen top galant-sail so ends
No observation

Friday the 18th

First Part fresh breezes ship heading S S W the watch employed in repairing a rib & various other jobs of ships duty Middle Part ship heading S W Latter Part the watch employed in setting up the fore rigging at 4 P M ship heading W S W at 10 raised ship heading S & by E at meridian heading S E so ends
Approach Long 167° West No observation

Saturday the 19th

Commences with light winds from the N W cloudy weather some rain ship heading S & E the watch employed in various jobs of ships duty Middle Part strong winds from the S Latter Part strong winds the S S E ship heading E the watch employed in receiving new running rigging so ends this Day
Lat 24° 02' south
Long 164° 44' West
