

Remarks on Board bound to the Coast of Chili
October 1846

Tuesday the 6th

Commences with light winds from W.S.W. steering E by N. Middle Part fresh gales steering E by S. Latter Part strong breezes, cours E by S ship under all sail the watch employed in moving the boat-house so ends this Day

Lat 38° 23'
Long 145° 06' 30"

Wednesday the 7th

Commences with strong breezes from W.S.W. ship under all sail steering E by S the watch employed as above Middle Part fresh gales accompanied with rain took in the main Royal & top-galant studdensail. Latter Part strong gales took in the top-galant-sails, flying jib. & double reefed the top-sails. the wind S.S.W. so ends this Day

Lat 38° 25'
Long 141° 12'

Thursday the 8th

Commences with strong breezes from S.S.E. ship heading E by N. turned one reef out of each of the top-sails. Middle Part turned the reefs out of the fore & main top-sails & set the main-top-galant sail. set the flying jib turned the reef out of the mizen-top-sail (set the fore & mizen top-galant-sail. Latter Part light wind so ends this Day Ship A.C.P. Ship C.H. Ship E.M.H.

Lat 38° 05'

Friday the 9th

Commences with light winds from the S.S.E. ship heading E by N. the watch employed in ships duty Middle Part light airs calms Latter Part much the same so ends this Day Latitude

Saturday the 10th

Commences with light airs & calms. Middle & Latter Parts much the same so ends this Day Lat 37° 42'

Long 138° 36' 30"

Sunday the 11th

Breeze 2 1/2 hours light airs & calms

Lat 37° 40' south

Monday the 12th

Commences with light airs & calms Middle Part calm. Lat Part light airs from the S.S.E. cloudy weather ship heading E so ends this Day no observation Ship A.C.P.

Tuesday the 13th

Commences with light winds from E.S.E. ship heading N.P. & by N. Middle Part the same. Latter Part fresh breezes from the E.S.E. ship heading N.P. & so ends.

Lat 36° 41'

Long 134° 21'

Wednesday the 14th

Commences with fresh breeze from the S.E. ship heading E.P. & Middle Part strong winds from S.E. by S ship heading E by N. took in the top-galant-sails & flying jib Latter Part fresh gales from S by E ship heading E by S. A heavy sea from S.S.W. so ends this Day Lat 36° 13'

Thursday the 15th

Commences with fresh breezes from S by W steering E.S.E. Middle Part fresh gales from S.S.W. Latter Part fresh breezes from the S.W. set the top-galant-sails flying jib main Royal & set the studdensails steering E.S.E. so ends this Day Lat 37° 08'

Long 132° 21'
