

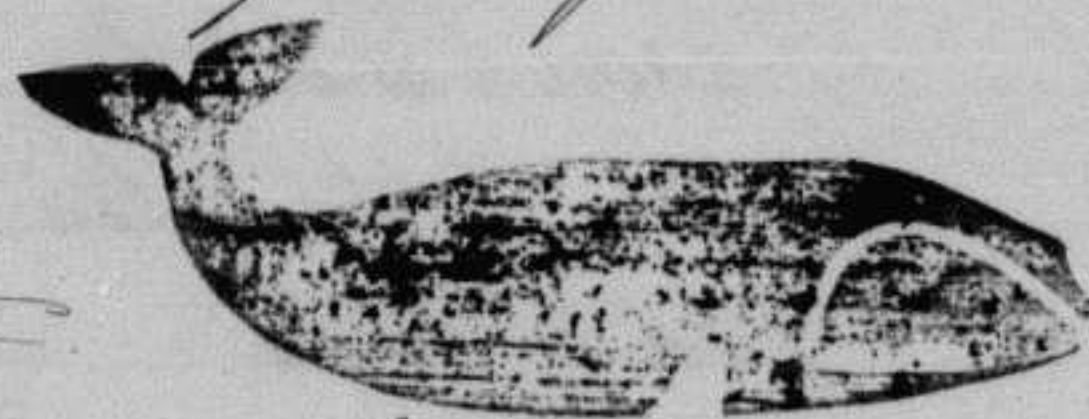
Remarks on Board on The Coast of Chili
November 1846

Wednesday the 4th

Brist Part strong winds from W S W ship standing by the wind on opposite tacks Middle & Latter Part the lowered for whales without success thus ends this Day

Thursday the 5th

Begins more moderate weather ten ships in sight all of them chasing whales one whale taken in sight Middle & Latter Parts pleasant weather at 10 AM lowered all four boats in chase of whales the Bow Boat got fast



Friday the 6th

Begins with light winds & pleasant weather. employed in killing the whale at 2 PM took line to the ship got line & commenced cutting at dark finished Middle Part the watch employed in clearing decks & boiling Latter Part fresh gales from the E N W with rain the watch employed as above so ends this Day

Saturday the 7th

Begins with strong gales cooled down took in the fore-sail & close reefed the main-top-sail Middle & Latter Parts strong gales from the westward so ends this Day slipping & sliding about the decks Lat 44° 08'

Sunday the 8th

Begins more moderate set the fore-sail & close reefed main-top-sail & commenced boiling again Middle & Latter Parts fresh gales at 11 AM finished boiling six ships in sight so ends this Day

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Monday the 9th

Begins with fresh breezes from the westward spoke the ship Rutanoff of New Bedford & the Bark Philip the first of Green-Port Middle Part fresh breezes Latter Part the watch employed in coopersing oil so ends this Day

Tuesday the 10th

Begins with fresh gales from the Westward the watch employed in coopersing oil spoke the ship seine of New Bedford & the ship Martha of Fair Haven Latter Part all hands employed in stowing down oil saw one whale lowered one boat without success 13 ships in sight so ends this Day No observation

Wednesday the 11th

Begins with light winds from the Northward saw Lord all hands employed as above 13 ships in sight at 1 o'clock closed the hatches & shortened sail for the night Middle & Latter Parts strong winds at meridian finished stowing down so ends

Thursday the 12th

Begins with strong gales ship under easy sail heading S W W Middle Part squally Latter Part the lower pt 10 lowered for Whales at meridian was returning to the ship without success saw 2 more whales gave them chase so ends this Day

Friday the 13th

Begins with strong breezes at 10 PM the Bow Boat got fast to one of the whales & soon after the S Boat got fast to the other killed them the Bow Boat whale sunk at 6 o'clock took the S Boats whale to the ship & commenced cutting at dark lashed down at 3 PM called all hands & commenced cutting at 9 finished cutting & commenced boiling 12 ships in sight
