

Remarks on Board on the Coast of Chile
January 1847

Saturday the 16th

Regins with fresh gales from the Westward ship under a press of sail steering North several ships in sight Middle Part much the same Latter Part ~~more moderate steering N. E. & S. so ends~~
V. A. & P. Lat 47° 18' Long 78° 07'


Sunday the 17th

Regins with fresh breezes from the S.W. with rain ships course N. E. by N. at 9 P.M. shifted our course to N. at 4 P.M. N. E. so ends this Day Lat 45° 40' Long 76° 26'



Monday the 18th

Regins with light winds & cloudy weather ships course N. E. at 2 P.M. veered ship to the South at daylight kept away N. E. & S. so ends this Day

Tuesday the 19th

Regins with light winds from the Southward ship under full sail course N. E. & S. at 3 P.M. saw the Island Carvo at 6 spoke the ship Massachusetts of Pantucket 19 mo^{rs} out with 1300 bbls 300 sperm Middle Part light winds & fine weather Latter Part the same saw sperm whales & took one

Land 15 miles distant

Wednesday the 20th

Regins with light winds & fine weather at 2 P.M. took the whale to the ship & commenced cutting at dark finished Mid Part employed in clearing decks Latter Part at daylight commenced boiling at 11 o'clock saw Whales lowered & took 2

Remarks on Board off the Island Carvo
Jan^y 1847

Thursday the 21st

Regins with fresh breezes took the ~~pl~~ before mentioned Whales to the ship & commenced cutting cut in one and left the other along side Middle Part employed in boiling Latter Part cut in the other Whale.
fine weather the land in sight so ends No obs.

Friday the 22^d

Regins with light winds & pleasant weather all hands employed in clearing decks & boiling Middle Part nearly calon Latter Part much the same saw the Massachusetts in chase of Whales so ends
V. A. & P. Lat 44° 57'

Saturday the 23^d

Regins with light winds from the Westward the watch employed in boiling Middle Part fresh gales with rain squalls cooled down the works Latter Part more moderate commenced boiling again
thus ends this Day

Sunday the 24th

Regins with light winds the watch employed in boiling Middle Part the same Latter Part fresh gales spoke the ship Briton of Warren 12 mo^{rs} 1000 bbls oil and the ship Heraine of Fair Haven 13 mo^{rs} 1600 so ends

Monday the 25th

Regins with fresh gales finished boiling in company with the Heraine saw the Land Middle & Latter Parts squally so ends

Tuesday the 26th

Regins with strong winds & cloudy weather Middle & Latter Parts strong gales & thick weather ship under a press of sail beating off shore
Lat 44° 48'
