

Remarks on Board Laying in St. Carlos Harbor
February 1847

Saturday the 6th

Begins with fine weather. took a raft of cask ashore & filled with water Latter Part the starboard watch ashore on liberty the Larboard watch employ in painting ship so ends this Day Off

Sunday the 7th

Begins with fine weather the watch employed as above Middle & Latter Parts fine weather

Monday the 8th

Begins with fresh gales from the Westward & clear weather Lat Part thick wet weather the watch took off 10 cask of water so end

Tuesday the 9th

Begins with ~~thick~~ fine weather the watch employed in painting ship at dark the liberty watch came on board some drunk & some sober Latter Part the starboard watch employed in painting ship the Larboard watch on liberty

Wednesday the 10th

These twenty four hours the same as yesterday

Thursday the 12th

These twenty four hours the starboard watch employed in taking aboard wood & water

Friday the 13th

Saturday the 14th

Sunday the 15th

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Monday the 16th

Tuesday the 16th

Wednesday the 17th

Rainy weather one watch on liberty

Thursday the 18th

This day took aboard a raft of water

Friday the 19th

one watch on liberty the other employed in various jobs on board

Saturday the 20th

These 24 hours all hands employed in getting ready for sea have short

Sunday the 21st

First Part light winds from the Westward Middle Part strong breezes from the Northward with a plenty of rain the Capt & Boats crew ashore Latter Part light wind from the S.W. at 6.30 got the ship under weigh & proceeded to sea employed in securing the anchors & cables so ends in Lat 41° 44' South

Monday the 22^d

Begins with light winds & fine weather steering to the Northward Middle Part much the same Latter Part ships course altered

Tuesday the 23^d

Begins with light winds & fine weather steering to the Northward Land in sight Latter Part the same one ship in sight Lat 59° 57'
