

Remarks on Board off Massafuero April 1847

Wednesday the 28th

Begins with light winds from E by S at Meridian lowered the boats for the before mentioned Whales chased them till dark without success & a hard chase at that

Middle Part light winds from S-S-E Latter Part the same spoke the ship Napoleon of Mant 115 Days out with 70 Bbls of sperm oil

Thursday the 29th

Begins with fresh breezes from S-S-E ship heading to the Eastward Middle & Latter Parts strong winds ship heading S-W employed in fitting the bot-stays this ends

Friday the 30th

Begins with fresh gales from S-S-E strong W-S-W Middle Part ship heading S-W Latter Part much the same this ends

Saturday the 1st

Begins with strong winds from S-S-E ship heading to Middle Part the same Latter Part light winds so ends this Day

P

Sunday the 2nd

Begins with light winds from S-S-E ship heading to the Eastward Middle Part light winds from S-W Latter Part light winds from W-S-W so ends this day

Monday the 3rd

Begins with fresh gales from the Westward ship heading S-W by S Middle & Latter Part light winds & thick weather so ends this Day

DB

Tuesday the 4th

Begins with light winds from the Westward & cloudy weather Middle Part much the same Latter Part light airs the watch employed in fitting the rigging so ends this Day

DB

Wednesday the 5th

Begins with light winds from W-S-W ship heading N-W the watch employed in fitting the rigging Latter Part much the same so ends this Day Lat 34 1/2 S

Z

Thursday the 6th

Begins with like winds from the westward ship heading to the Northward the watch employed in fitting rigging Middle & Latter Parts light winds & fine weather Land in sight Lat 34 40

C

Friday the 7th

Begins with light winds from the Westward ship heading to the Northward the watch employed in fitting the rigging Latter Part the same so ends

P

Saturday the 8th

Begins as yesterday Middle & Latter Part frequent squalls of rain so ends
