

Remarks on Board at Salabaziana July 1847

Monday the 5<sup>th</sup>

First & Middle Parts fine weather Latter Part strong gales from the Northward sent down the rig-masts fore & aft so ends

Tuesday the 6<sup>th</sup>

First Part strong gales from the N at 3 P M let go the 2<sup>d</sup> anchor Middle Part moderate Latter Part fresh gales so ends

Wednesday the 7<sup>th</sup>

First Part fresh gales from the N one water on liberty the other employed in ships duty Middle Part fine Latter Part much the same all hands employed in ships duty

Thursday the 8<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light winds from the S Latter Part at 6 hoors up the 2<sup>d</sup> anchor & proceeded to sea arrived. Barque Agustina de Callas

Friday the 9<sup>th</sup>

First Part light winds from the S S E & clear weather all hands employed in sawing the anchors clearing decks fitting Boats &c Middle & Latter Parts fine weather

Saturday the 10<sup>th</sup>

First & Middle Parts fine weather Latter Part thick weather the watch employed in sawing down the cables

Sunday the 11<sup>th</sup>

First Part strong winds from the N N W with rain Middle & Latter Parts light winds

Monday the 12<sup>th</sup>

First Part light winds & cloudy ship standing to the S W Latter Part strong winds with rain so ends this Day

Tuesday the 13<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours much the same as yesterday

Wednesday the 14<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours much the same

Lat 38° 05

Thursday the 15<sup>th</sup>

Commences with strong winds & clear weather ship under easy sail steering S S E Middle Part veered ship to the N W Latter Part light air one sail in sight Lat 38° 14

Friday the 16<sup>th</sup>

Nothing of Note

Saturday the 17<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours light air & fine weather ship heading to the N W Lat 38° 19

Sunday the 18<sup>th</sup>

Commences with light winds N N W ships course S N E by N the Island Mocha in sight at 5 P M veered ship to the N N W at 6 shortened sail for the Night Middle Part squally Latter Part strong gales so ends this Day

Monday the 19<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fresh gales from the N N W Middle & Latter Parts more moderate
