

Remarks on Board Homeward Bound
A. S. P. September 1847

Saturday the 19th

Begins with strong winds from WNW reefed the fore-sail & took in the fore-top-sail & set it again close reefed & set the mizen-top-sail close reefed steering NNE & Middle Part strong winds from the NW & thick weather took in the mizen-top-sail steering NNE Latter Part strong winds from W by N set the jib & main-sail reefed & the mizen-top-sail close reefed steering NNE & so ends this Day Lat 54° 11' Long 59° 25'

Sunday the 19th

Begins with strong winds from W by S steering NNE Fine weather but rather cool Middle Part fresh breezes from WSW turned the close reef out of the fore-top-sail & the second reef out of the main-top-sail & set the main-top-gallant sail steering NNE Latter Part fresh breezes from the SSW turned the reefs out of the fore-top-sail & set the top-mast & lower studding-sails steering W by W so ends this Day Lat 54° 58' Long 56° 17' by Lunar

Monday the 20th

Begins with light winds from SSW & fine weather set all sail steering NNE Middle Part the wind changed the NW took in the studding-sails ship by the wind heading NNE Latter Part light winds from NW by N ship heading NE by N by the wind

Lat 50° 01'
Long 55° 10'

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Tuesday the 21st

Begins with light winds from the NW & fine weather ship heading NNE Middle Part the wind changed to the NE tacked ship heading WNW Latter Part fresh gales from the N ship heading WNW took in the top-gallant-sails & flying jib so ends this Day Lat 48° 54' Long

Wednesday the 22nd

Begins with fresh gales from the N ship heading WNW at 3 P.M. double reefed the top-sails at 4 the wind changed to the NNE veered ship & reefed the main-sail heading NE Middle Part strong winds from NW by N ship heading NE by N Latter Part fresh gales from SW by W & a heavy sea from the N ship heading NNE so ends this Day Lat 48° 00' Long 54° 24'

Thursday the 23rd

Begins with light winds from W by S ship heading NNE turned out the reefs & set the top-gallant-sails & flying jib Middle Part from the NW by W fresh gales took in the top-gallant-sails & flying jib & double reefed the top-sails ship heading N Latter Part a fine breeze from the W turned one reef out of the main-top-sail & one out of the fore & set the main-top-gallant-sail ship heading N by W
