

Sept. 1847

Thursday the 30th

Begins with fresh gales from the S W
 & equally weather took in the fore-top-mast-stand
 sail steering E Middle Part strong winds
 from S W by S took in the top gallant-sails &
 last reefed the mizen-top-sail steering E by N
 Latter Part strong winds from S S W double reefed
 the fore & main top-sails & set the jib & main-
 sail steering E so ends this Day Lat 38° 46'
 Long 38° 12'

October 1847

Friday the 1st

Begins with strong winds from the S turned one
 reef out of the main-top-sail steering E
 Middle Part fresh gales of the S & a heavy sea
 from the S W turned one reef out of the fore-top-sail
 & one out of the mizen top-sail steering E
 Latter Part fresh gale from S by E Lat 38° 25' S
 Long 36° 07'

Saturday the 2^d

Begins with moderate winds from S E
 trued out the reefs & set the main top gallant sail
 steering E saw thousands of whale birds &
 many other kinds Middle Part light winds from
 S by E set the fore & mizen top gallant sails &
 flying jib steering E Latter Part light winds
 from the S S E steering E Lat 38° 11' S
 Long 33° 44'

Sunday the 3^d

Begins with light winds from the S
 the watch employed in making a pair of
 jib pendants & steering E by S Middle Part
 light variable winds Latter Part light winds
 from the N steering E Lat 38° 06'
 Long 32° 16'

Monday the 4th

Begins with light winds from N N E
 ship heading E under all sail Middle Part
 fresh breezes took in the top gallant sails & flying jib
 Latter Part double reefed the fore top sail & single
 reefed the main & mizen
 Lat 38° 10'
 Long 28° 50'
