Begins with light winds & rain squalls steering N by W the watch employed in various & gobs of ships duty Middle Part rain squalls & calms Latter Part light winds from N by W ship by the wind heading N by W saw a ship to windward supposed her to be an English merchantman

Monday November the 8th

Begins with light winds from the East, steering N by W under all sail. Middle Part fresh N by E trade winds coars N by W. Latter Part strong trade winds all hands employed in turning in the fore & main rigging & steering N by W so ends this day

Begins with light winds all hands employed in turning in the fore & main rigging steering N by W in N by W Middle Part light winds steering N by W in N by W Latter Part fresh breezes all hands employed in fitting the rigging steering N by W in N by W

Begins with light winds all hands employed about the rigging steering N by W in N by W Middle Part very light trades coars N by W in N by W Latter Part light winds all hands employed in fitting the rigging & painting ship steering N by W in N by W

Begins with very light trade winds all hands employed in fitting rigging & painting ship steering N by W Middle Part very light winds had one rain squall Latter Part a fine breeze all hands employed on the rigging steering N by W so ends the day

Begins with a fine breeze all hands on the rigging steering N by W Middle Part steering N by W by W with a fine breeze Latter Part a fine breeze all hands employed in fitting rigging steering N by W by W
