

Saturday November 27th 1847
Came with fresh gales from the westward
Employed in hauling up cable and
making every necessary preparation for
port. At 2 P.M. saw gay head a head vessel
of all size and descriptions around us
steering different courses at 3 P.M. took
a pilot from the Josiah Sturge of
Helm's Hole. the wind being a head we were
obliged to go in to Tarspaulin Cove and
anchor. after the anchor was drop and
the sails furled the Capt and Pilot
went in shore

Sunday the 28th 1847
Begins with strong winds from the North
Middle Part strong winds from the NW
at 4:50 P.M. got under weigh & beat out
of the sound at meridian the sun & pigs bearing
N E one mile distant. Thus ends this Day

Monday the 29th 1847
Begins with light winds from the
W E N at 1 P.M. passed butterbunk light
at 2 passed round hill light at 2:30 passed
Clark's Point light at 3 anchored above
Parners Island furled the sails & went ashore
Thus ends this voyage
