Remarks Tuesday 5th November

Begins with a fresh breeze from the westward and a high sea finished cutting in the whale and cleared up the deck by this time a very strong breeze took in the all sail but hauled M. Mynail fore-spar without a hauled, & M. Mynail hauled through the night, in the morning took in the fore-spar & set the foresail got the works under way commenced hoisting, latter part of the rather more moderate but a very heavy swell.
