Saw two sail the first part of the day steering to the northward. In the morning saw a whale going to windward could not determine exactly what he was. Steered to the southward till 5 P.M. to the N.E. till 7 P.M. to the S. till 10 S to the P.E. the rest of the day

Wednesday 11

Begins with a strong breeze and fair weather, middle quite moderate, ^{rather} fair part much as the first. Saw several porpoises and two seals in the forenoon.
Steamed to the M. B. till 7 A.M. and to the S. & S. B. the rest of the day.

Thursday 12

Begins with a fresh breeze from the S.E. and flying clouds middle much the same with a squall of rain. latter part more moderate and fine weather. At night took in the M.T. gallant-boat & mainsail in the morning set the mainsail, & in the forenoon unbent the M.T. gallant-sail to repair and bent another. Saw two sail the westward of the day one to windward & one to the leeward. Spoke barque Constitution, Gifford, of New-York. latter part of the day saw a sail to windward. Steered to the S. till 12 M. N. to the N.E. till 4 A.M. to the S. till 10 and to the N.E. the rest of the day.

 Begins with a fresh breeze and fair weather, middle much the
 same, latter part more moderate and clear, saw a ship to the N.W.
 & one to the westward. Steamed N.C. all this day.

Sunday 14

Begin with a pleasant breeze and fair weather middle of
as the first, latter had a fresh breeze. At 3 P.M. spoke Ship
Independence, Com. of M.B. 35 from the cut 1500 and a ship on
the weather beam in the morning. Steered to the north west till 2 P.M.
to the S. S. 40. W. and to the N.E. the rest of the day.

Begins with a fresh breeze and fair weather, middle clouds, but in the wind, unsteady by spells fresh & others more moderate, & light squalls of rain, ends with clear weather. Sails a sail to the Northward just before March. Returned to the N.E. at three o'clock.

Sunday 15

44 Begins with a fresh breeze and clear weather, middle and latter part heavy fresh and hard flying clouds. A ship in sight to the westward, called her the Independence, a ship in sight to the eastward in the morning which tacked and stood to the shore to the S. E. & A. M. to the N. E. & W. and to the S. E. & W. 120.
