Monday Nov. 28th

First part brisk wind from East to E.S.E. and thick flying clouds. Course N. by E. with all sails set to the best advantage.

Middle part much the same strong wind from East to E.S.E. and rather squally weather. Course N. by E. Latter part moderate breeze from E. to E.S.E. and thin flying clouds. Course N. by E. watch employed busily in repairing our sails and rigging.

First part brisk wind from E.S.E. and squally weather. Stood to the South by the wind with all sails set to the best advantage. Watch employed busily in repairing our sails and rigging.

Middle part brisk wind from N.E. by N. and thin flying clouds. Stood to the N. by the wind.

Latter part light breeze from N.E. and clear pleasant weather. Stood to the South by the wind with all sails set to the best advantage. Watch employed in repairing our sails and rigging.

Wednesday November 30th

First part light baffling wind from N.E. and clear warm weather. Stood to the N.W. by the wind. Watch employed in repairing our sails rigging &c. at 4 P.M. our ship passed to the westward of us. Standing to the S.W.

Middle part much the same light baffling winds from N.E. and clear pleasant weather. Stood to the S.W. by the wind.

Latter part much the same light breeze from N.E. and clear warm pleasant weather. Stood to the N.W. by the wind. Watch employed in repairing rigging cleaning and bundling bone. a new. So was all well.

Lat obs 20. 18 South. Long by L. 53. 18. 30. 00

Thursday Dec. 1st

First part light baffling winds from N.E. and clear warm pleasant weather. Stood to the N.W. by the wind. Watch employed rattling and felling our rigging and cleaning and bundling whale bone.

Middle part much the same light baffling winds from N.E. and thin flying clouds. Stood to the N.W. by the wind.

Latter part much the same light baffling winds from N.E. and thick steady weather. Stood to the N.W. by the wind. Watch employed in felling and rattling down rigging and drying cleaning and bundling whale bone.
