

Saturday Dec 30th, 1848.

This day the wind has been a gale, with frequent squalls, middle part of the day saw Spinnaker Whales close to the ship but it was so rough that it was not safe to lower the boats
Lat 43, 13 South Long 54, 41 West

Sunday 31st

Commenced with cloudy weather, light breeze and variable, with sudden changes from calm to strong breezes and with fair weather and a moderate breeze

Lat 46, 01 South Long 54, 44 West

Monday, January 1st, 1849

The first part of the day fair with a light wind, middle part breeze and squally, latter part more moderate again, spoke ship Addison of New Bedford 4 months out with no sail

Lat 46, 41 South Long 54, 01

Tuesday, Jan 2d.

Commenced with pleasant weather and a fresh breeze, middle part light air and foggy, latter part fresh breeze and cloudy

Lat 47, 16 South Long 54, 30 West

Wednesday Jan 3d

The wind has blown strong, but the weather has been fair most of the day - the barometer falls a gale

Lat 48, 10 South Long 59, 52 West

Thursday, Jan 4th

Commenced with calm and pleasant weather but a very heavy swell in the sea, latter part going to in a gale of wind which is fast increasing

Lat 49, 36 South Long 60, 20 West

Friday, Jan 5th

The first part of the day it blew a gale of wind latter part more moderate and pleasant

Lat 47, 13 South Long 60, 07 West

Saturday, January 6th, 1849

The first part of this day has been pleasant with a moderate breeze, middle very hazy, latter part calm
Lat 47, 47 South Long 60, 36 West

Sunday Jan 7th

Commenced with a fine wind and pleasant weather Ship with all sail set steering S.W. middle of the day saw a Ship latter part pleasant, ends there 24 hours

Lat 49, 01 South Long 61, 17 West

Monday, Jan 8th

Commenced with pleasant weather and light wind, but a very heavy swell, middle of the day spoke Ship Dunbarton of New Bedford 4 months from home clear, latter part squally - Falkland islands bearing S.E. by S about 46 miles distant
Lat 50, 33 South Long 62, 06 West

Tuesday, Jan 9th

This day has been pleasant, with a fine breeze
Lat 51, 47 South Long 63, 14 West

Wednesday, Jan 10th

The weather has been the same today as yesterday
Lat 54, 19 South Long 65, 28 West

Thursday, Jan 11th

Commenced with a fine breeze and pleasant weather. Staten Land, is in sight about 15 miles distant, it is very uneven land, and we can plainly discern the snow on the mountains there are a multitude of birds around the ship in all directions latter part of the day squally

Lat 54, 37 South Long 65, 10 West

Friday, Jan 12th 1849

To day we have had fair weather, with a fresh breeze, one ship in sight

Lat 55, 26 South Long 62, 55 West
