

Sunday, April 22d, 1849

This day has been pleasant with a very light wind, the Island of Mowee is 94 miles distant—

Leath 20'42. North " Long 154'15 West

Monday, April 23d

This day has been pleasant, and calm, the
Island of Kooee in sight, but we shall not get in to day—

by Tuesday April 24th

To day has been thick, and rainy most of the time, towards noon it lighted up so that we could see where we was, and found ourselves off the east end of Komee, tacked Ship and steered N West for the other side of the land, The Island is very high and mountainous, but has a more fertile appearance than other islands of the Pacific that we have been near; I could see some houses amongst the hills, that look more like corn houses than any thing else.

Wednesday April 25th 1849

Commenced with a strong breeze and pleasant weather, the Islands of Maui and Mowee in sight. this morning, latter part of the day fair, and a fine breeze, at 12 o'clock P.M. came to anchor, off the Port of Lahaina, all on board well after a long and tedious passage of 7 months and 5 days - we have on board 300 bbls sperm

Thursday April 26th, 1849.

To day I have been ashore to see the town of Seabaina, it is quite a pleasant place, but far from being a handsome one, it does not look much like any American town I ever saw, I spent most of the afternoon with Mrs. Bolles of New London, and called to see Mrs. Hall & Miss Cole which are spending the season ashore, and liked them very much, To day we have had a treat of fish, meat, and vegetables, and Water melons, Musk melons and Bananas - I think we shall get along first rate for the present -

Friday, April 27th, 1849.

The day has been pleasant, though very warm. I have been on shore this afternoon, and took tea at Judge Parsons. This evening Capt. Fisher, and Capt. Adams have spent the evening with us, Capt. Adams is going to stay all night -

Saturday April 28th 1847.

This day has been pleasant also, I have spent the day on Board of the Ship, Capt. Reed (of the Ship Sea Breeze) has been here and taken tea with us, it is now still winter here in part now, as there are but three ships here —

Sunday, April 29th, 1849.

The day I have been on shore and spent the day, with Mrs. Heath & Mrs. Lane at Judge Parsons, and have had a very pleasant visit. The Baptist minister has gone to Honolulu, so there is no church for us to attend. I have been very much amused to see the Canoes dressed up and going to church. Some are dressed in white muslin and bare feet, some in dresses with thick leather shoes, &c. &c.

Sunday, April, 30th

This day has been pleasant, with a strong wind.
The ship ~~the~~ ^{the} Anawakond, of ^{the} Salomoth has arrived here this evening, the
Massachusetts and America sailed from here on a cruise Saturday morn

by Tuesday April May 1st, 1849

His day has been pleasant, nothing of
interest has occurred today, I have been on board the ship all day.

Wednesday May 14 1887

I have been ashore to spend the day with Mrs. Bolles, and have had a very pleasant visit, I have been much amused to see the natives swim in the surf, it seems as though it was their natural element. I also saw some sitting on the beach, eating their Loi and raw fish, the Canacas are a lazy indolent class of beings, I expected to find them more civilized than they are here,
