

Journal of a Voyage commenced Sept 13<sup>th</sup> 1860

Thursday Sept 13<sup>th</sup> 1860 -  
At 11 am took the Anchor and stood out  
of the Bay with the wind S W at 12 o'clock  
the pilot left so ended this day

Friday Sept 14<sup>th</sup> 1860

Begins with strong wind from the S W  
and fine weather all hands employed in  
stowing cables and anchors steering S E  
middle part the same latter part more  
moderate steering E by S a number sails  
in sight all hands employed in fitting  
Boats so ended this day  
Lat by Obs 39 32 Long by Chro 68.40

Saturday Sept 15<sup>th</sup> 1860

Commences with light wind from S W  
middle part winds from the S latter  
part very light airs from the S E  
ships by the wind to the Eastward  
all hands employed in fitting Boats  
Lat By Obs 39.45 Long By Chro 65.47

Sunday Sept 16<sup>th</sup> 1860

This day Begins with light airs from  
the S E steering by the wind with the  
larboard tack On Board middle part  
light baffling wind and Calm latter  
part strong wind from the S E steering  
by the wind on the Starboard tack  
Lat by Obs 39.54 Long By Chro 64.39
