

Tuesday Sept 25<sup>th</sup> 1860  
Commenced with a strong wind from the  
South steering E & E middle and latter  
part Light Wind from the S W  
Lat by Obs 41.53 Long by Chro 42.30

Wednesday Sept 26<sup>th</sup> 1860  
This day a fresh wind from S W  
steering E & E with all sail set employed  
in fitting ship and sheathing the decks  
Lat by Obs 41.45 Long by Chro 37.00

Thursday Sept 27<sup>th</sup> 1860  
Begins with a fine wind from the S W  
and pleasant middle and latter part  
a light wind steering S E latter part  
steered S E so ended this day  
Lat by Obs 40.53 Long by Chro 36.10

Friday September 28<sup>th</sup> 1860  
Came with a light breeze from the West  
ward and fine weather saw a Pin Back  
middle and latter part wind S W  
Saw a shoal of Blackfish steering S E  
Lat by Obs 39.38 Long by Chro 33.38

Saturday Sept 29<sup>th</sup> 1860  
Commenced with a fresh breeze from the  
S and fine weather steering S E by E  
at Sun down took in sail for the  
night and halled on the wind to the S E  
at midnight wore ship to the W at daylight  
made all sail to E & E at 7 A M the wind  
halled to the E steering by the wind  
to the S with fine weather so ended

Sunday Sept 30<sup>th</sup> 1860  
Commences with light air and calm headlined  
to the S at 10 A M wind from the S E and fine  
weather steering by the wind to the Eastward  
latter part strong wind and equally at 3 P M  
took in topsail and sails so ended this day  
Lat by Obs 39.48 Long by Chro 31.37

Monday Sept 1<sup>st</sup> 1861  
Begins with strong breeze S W and pleasant  
steering by the wind to the eastward at  
1 P M double reefed the topsails wore in  
sight bearing E & E at 4 P M wore ship  
to the Westward wore bearing S E by E  
4 Leagues Flores in sight middle part strong  
winds at 11 P M wore ship to the E at  
at 7 A M Flores bearing S E 4 Leagues  
wore ship to the Westward at 11 A M  
wore ship to the Eastward Flores  
in sight so ended this day

Tues October 2<sup>d</sup> 1860  
Commences with strong wind from the  
South steering by the wind to the Eastward  
under double reefed topsails at 5 P M  
Flores bearing S E 3 Leagues dist wore  
ship with the main yard aback  
to speak the ship Hunters of S B  
Capt Allen & month Out with 2000 lbs  
Capt came on Board and got some  
papers and reported ships taking oil  
in 42 S at 8 P M kept the ship off  
S and made all sail middle and latter  
part strong winds and a very heavy swell  
steering S by Compass so ended
