

Wednesday Oct 3<sup>rd</sup> 1860

Begins with a strong wind from the S by W with a very heavy swell steering to the North with all sail set and several sail standing to the Eastward at 6 P.M. more moderate took in sail for the night middle part strong wind from the S by W at daylight double reefed the topsails set jib and mainsail and stood on the wind to the Eastward so ended this day

Lat by Obs 42.28 Long by Chron 32.34

Thursday Oct 4<sup>th</sup> 1860

Commences with a strong wind from the S steering by the wind to the eastward under double reefed topsails jib and mainsail at 6 o'clock wore ship to the west and took in jib and mainsail middle part the same at daylight wore ship to Eastward and set jib and mainsail so ended

Lat by Obs 42.17 Long by Chron 32.54

Friday Oct 5<sup>th</sup> 1860

Commences with a strong wind from the S and good weather steering by the wind to the Eastward with double reefed topsails with heavy sea running at 6 set whole main topsail middle part more moderate set all sail latter part moderate breeze at noon backed ship to the westward so ended

Lat by Obs 42.44 Long 29.50

Saturday Oct 6<sup>th</sup> 1860

Begins with a moderate breeze from the S and fine weather steering by the wind to the westward at 6 P.M. backed ship to the Eastward at 6 o'clock backed to the west at half past 8 o'clock raised whales lower and struck one and killed him the Boat in Chase of whales so ended

Sunday Oct 7<sup>th</sup> 1860

Commences with light airs and Calms the Boat in chase of whales at 2 o'clock came on board at 5 P.M. took the whale along side and got ready for cutting took in sail to lay by the whale at 8 o'clock wore ship at 6 commenced cutting latter part the same

Lat by Obs 42.29 Long by Chron 32.59

Monday Oct 8<sup>th</sup> 1860

Begins with a moderate breeze from E by S with heavy swell ship heading to the S at 1 P.M. finished cutting the whale and set double reefed topsails at sundown the locker squads took in fore and main topsails the watch cleaning away the head and getting ready for boiling at midnight commenced boiling latter moderate breeze from the S by E all hands employed in boiling and breaking out for Shooks

Lat by Obs 42.02 Long by Chron 30.11

Tuesday Oct 9<sup>th</sup> 1860

Commences with a moderate breeze from the S by E and fine weather steering by the wind to the South at 10 P.M. wore ship and steered S by E Employed in Boiling latter part the same

Lat by Obs 42.03 Long by Chron 29.57

Wednesday Oct 10<sup>th</sup> 1860

Commences with a light breeze from the S by W and fine weather steering S by E with all sail set employed in boiling at sundown took in topgallant sails middle and latter part calm at midnight coiled down the whale main Vixty Five Barrels exother in sight this day
