

Thursday Oct 11th 1860

Commences with Calm saw a number of Grampuses at 2 P.M. ship laying in a calmer with the three top sails set middle part the same at daylight a light air from the W. made all sail to the S. Latter part light squalls of rain so ends

Friday Oct 12th 1860

Begins with a light breeze from the west with some rain at 4 wind halled to the S. and Cloudy at 6 P.M. kept the ship S by W middle part light air and calms latter part the same

Saturday Oct 13th 1860

Commences with Calm all hands employed in Breaking Out between decks at 6 P.M. Light breeze from the S. W. steering S. W. One sail in sight steering to the S. E. Middle part moderate breeze from the S. Latter part the same steering by the wind to the Southward two sails in sight

Lat by Obs 41.34 Long by Chro 30.12

Sunday Oct 14th 1860

Commences with a moderate breeze from the S. and Cloudy steering by the wind heading from S to S. W. One ship in sight to the S. Middle part very moderate at daylight Pogo in sight to the S. 10 Leagues dist Latter part Calms with light air from the W. steering by the wind to the S.

Lat by Obs 29.59 Long by Chro 30.15

Monday Oct 15th 1860

Commences with very light baffling air and Cloudy at dawn Flores bearing W 10 Leagues Corro N. N. W. middle part calm at 3 P.M. took a Breeze from W. steering by the wind to the S. S. W. Latter part moderate from the W. Beating up to Flores so ends

Tuesday Oct 16th 1860

Commences with a strong breeze from the W. steering by the wind to the Southward at sundown Flores bearing west six Leagues dist at midnight Equator Wind halled to the S. E. at daylight stood in for the Land at 3 P.M. West shore with a Boat for recruits Latter part strong wind from the S. E. ship off and on at Port Lagunas

Wednesday Oct 17th 1860

Commences with a strong breeze from the S. E. and heavy swell ship off the Port Lagunas recruiting at 4 P.M. went on board at 8 P.M. stood off to the S. E. at 2 A.M. stood in for the Land at 9 A.M. sent the Boat on shore to land a Passenger at meridian Boat came on board kept the ship off to the South

Thursday Oct 18th 1860

Commences with a light wind from the S. running round to the West of the Island at 6 Lay the head yards aback to the S. W. of the Island two Boats came off and took the things belonging to the passengers at 7 stood to the South wind from the Eastward Latter part strong wind from the S. steering by the wind to the South Employed in coopersing Oil to land at fayall

Lat by Obs 38.27

Friday Oct 19th 1860

Begins with a strong wind from the S. and Cloudy with light squalls of rain Employed in coopersing Oil at 6 P.M. wind halled to the S. E. wore ship to the Eastward middle part the same at daylight Fayal bearing S. E. 15 Leagues steering in for the Land so ends this day
