

Saturday Oct 20th 1860

Commences with a light wind from the S and fine weather steering in for Payal at 6 P.M. Bore bearing E & S 6 Leagues distant South End of Payal W. Lay of the passage all night with very light winds at daylight stood in for point Vista to Land Oil at 9 A.M. went on shore Lat ter part strong breeze with squalls Laying off the Port so ended this day

Sunday Oct 21st 1860

Cornes with a moderate breeze from the South with squalls of rain at 1 P.M. put 64 lbs Oil on Board a Launch to take on shore at 4 P.M. went on Board the ship and stood to the S with a light wind from the S at daylight St George bearing S 5 Leagues dist. Terceira E 6 Leagues at 6 P.M. kept the ship S to go to the S of the Land with strong winds took in topsail sails at 9 double reefed topsails took in jib and mainsail at 11 Close reefed the topsails strong wind from the W at meridian Terceira bearing South 5 Leagues distant two ships in sight to the S.E. so ended this day

Monday Oct 22nd 1860

Commences with Moderate Gale from the W & S and squally at 6 more moderate with rain wind from the S steering by the wind to the East under three Close reefed topsails middle part very light airs at daylight Terceira bearing S 10 Leagues distant latter part light wind from the S and Cloudy steering S at meridian St Michael bearing S 10 Leagues dist

Tuesday Oct 23rd 1860

Commences with a very light air from the S and good weather steering S a very heavy swell from the S at 4 P.M. hauled the ship up to the Land at 6 P.M. Bore S 6 Leagues dist. wind very light from the S & E middle part light airs and calm at daylight St Michael bearing South 5 Leagues dist. Moderate Breeze from the W kept the ship to E to run to the East of the P at meridian the middle part of the Island Bore South 5 Leagues distant

Wednesday Oct 24th 1860

Commences with a strong wind to the W steering E & S at 3 P.M. took in topsail sails at 6 Long Bore W 4 Leagues middle part strong W & S with squalls with rain steering S & E at 10 P.M. Double reefed the topsails and took in jib and mainsail. Latter part more moderate with light squalls of rain wind from the S steering S & W

Lat by Obs 37.01 Thursday Oct 25th 1860

Commences with a light wind from the S and a very heavy swell steering S & W three sails in sight at 6 P.M. moderate breeze from the S & E and fine weather with a very swell from the S middle and latter part light winds from the North and fine weather steering S & W

Lat by Obs 35.07 Long by Chron 23.15

Friday Oct 26th 1860

Commences with a light breeze from the S and fine weather steering S & W several sails in sight middle and latter part the same & nothing more remarkable so ended

Lat by Obs 24.01 Long by Chron 23.17
