

Wednesday March 6th 1861

Commences with calm and pleasant heading round the compass. employed repairing sails at 8 P.M. the Island S.E. 20 miles middle and latter part moderate breeze from the E.S.E. and fine weather at daylight Lundy Island S.E. 10 miles tacked ship and stood to the S at meridian Gundy Island and Macolly Island in sight

Lat By Obs 29° 43

Thursday March 7th 1861

Commences with a moderate breeze and fine weather wind from the E steering to the S three ships in sight at sundown Macollys Island S.E. Easter Is. S.E. steering S at 9 P.M. halled on the wind heading S.E. at daylight French Rock S by E 25 miles dist latter moderate breeze and cloudy at meridian the Rock N.E. W 10 miles steering S by W 20 end

Friday March 8th 1861

Commences with a moderate breeze from the E.S.E. and cloudy steering S.W. at sundown took in topsail and halled on the wind to the S.E. middle and latter part light wind and good weather at 10 P.M. tacked to the S.E. at daylight the Rock S.E. 20 miles wind from the S heading to the westward at 11 A.M. tacked to the S.E.

Saturday ^{9th} 1861 Lat by Obs 31° 12

This day comes with a light wind from the S and fine weather a bark in sight steering by the wind to the Eastward at 6 P.M. tacked to the westward the rock S.E. 20 miles middle part light winds at 1 A.M. tacked to the E latter part calm one ship in sight at noon the Rock S by E 20 miles Employed repairing Boat

Sunday March 10th 1861

Commences with calm ship heading all round the compass Employed repairing Boat at 4 P.M. put the Larboard Boat on the cranes at 7 Light air from the S.E. heading E.S.E. at Sunset French Rock S by E 20 miles middle part light air latter part calm at sunrise the Rock N by W 20 miles two ships in sight to the S heading to the S.W.

Lat by Obs 31. 10

Monday March 11th 1861

Commences with a strong wind from the E and squally steering S by E three ships in sight at 6 P.M. Macollys Island N.E. by E 7 leagues wind moderate from the E.S.E. steering by the wind to the S at 12 wore ship to the S at 1 P.M. wore to the S.E. latter part strong wind from the E.S.E. steering S at 8 P.M. Sunday Island in sight to the S at meridian Gundy Is. S.E. 20 miles distant

Tuesday March 12th 1861

Comes with strong winds from the E.S.E. and squally steering around the Island to the N at 1 P.M. halled on the wind to the S.E. and double reefed the Topsails at 6 took in Jib and Main sail the Island S by W 20 miles distant saw Grampuses this afternoon at midnight wore ship to the S latter part fresh gales at 4 P.M. took in Fore and Mizzen topsails at 8 wore ship to the S.E. at 6 set double reefed Topsails at 9 A.M. took them in again. Laying to the S.E. under double reefed Main topsail and fore sail at noon the land S by W.

Lat by Obs 28. 45

Wednesday March 13th 1861

Comes with strong gales from the E.S.E. and good weather heading to the S.E. at 7 P.M. wore ship to the S middle and latter part strong gales and good weather at 8 A.M. wore ship to the S.E. at daylight the Island S.W. 20 miles

Lat by Obs 28. 48
