

Sunday July 14th 1861

Commences with a strong wind from the E and fine weather steering by the wind to the S at 6 PM tacked ship to the S at 1 PM tacked to the S middle and latter part strong wind and good weather

Lat By Obs 13.55 S Long By Chro 168.56 E

Comes with strong wind from the Eastward and fine weather steering by the wind to the S at 8 PM tacked ship to the S middle part good weather latter part strong wind and squally at daylight Aurora Island in sight at 9 AM Pentecote Island bearing S 30 miles at 9 AM tacked to the SE at meridian land in sight

Lat by Obs 15.18 S Long by Chro 168.57 E

Tuesday 16th 1861

Comes with a strong wind from the ESE and squally steering by the wind to the SE middle part strong breeze and fine weather at 11 PM tacked ship to the S latter part strong wind at 9 AM saw Pentecote Island to the W 30 miles dist at meridian a number of islands in site to the S steering by the wind to the S

Lat by Obs 16.10 S Long 169.10 E

Wednesday July 17th 1861

Comes with fresh breeze from the E and fine weather steering by the wind to the S middle and latter part the same at 11 PM tacked ship to the S at 8 AM tacked to the S at 8 AM saw Erromango Island bearing S 30 miles distant at meridian 10 miles

Lat By Obs 18.14 S Long By Chro 169.34 E

Thursday July 18th 1861

Comes with a moderate breeze from the E and fine weather steering by the wind to the S at sundown Erromango west 10 miles dist middle part wind ESE at 11 PM saw the Island Panna and volcano Burning tacked ship to the S at 3 tacked to the SE at daylight wind halled to the S Panna S 15 miles dist Erromango

SE 30 miles distant wind halled to the S steered south at 9 AM steered SE at 11 halled on the wind to the E at meridian Erromango S by W 15 miles Annaton S 7 W
Lat By Obs 19.41 S Long by Chro 170.30 E

Friday July 19th 1861

Comences with strong winds from the SE and good weather steering to the E at 4 PM lost sight of the land middle part wind from the SE steering E by S latter part strong wind and squally wind from the S

Lat By Obs 17.57 S Long by Chro 173.19 E

Saturday July 20th 1861

First part light wind and calm with rain wind baffling heading to all points of the compass middle part the same latter part light winds and from south to SE W with rain steering E by S

Lat by Obs 20.14 S Long 174.10 E

Sunday July 21st 1861

Commences with light wind and baffling from WSE W to S with rain steering E by S middle part fresh breeze from the W and rainy steering ESE latter part wind from S with squalls of rain steering E by S

Lat By Obs 21.00 S Long By Chro 176.42 E

Monday July 22^d 1861

Comes with a fresh breeze from the S and cloudy steering E by S middle and latter part fresh breeze and good weather wind from the S steering E so ends this day

Lat By Obs 20.02 S Long By Chro 177.40 E

Tuesday July 23^d 1861

Comes with a fresh breeze from the S and fine weather steering E at 6 PM took in topgallant sail and halled on the wind to the W S W middle and latter part wind and weather the same at daylight set all sail and steered by the wind heading E by S at 10 AM saw the Island of One a head at meridian land E by S 10 miles dist Lat By Obs 20.53 S Long By Chro 178.55 W
